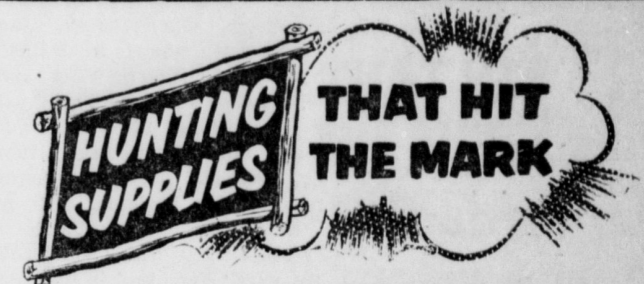

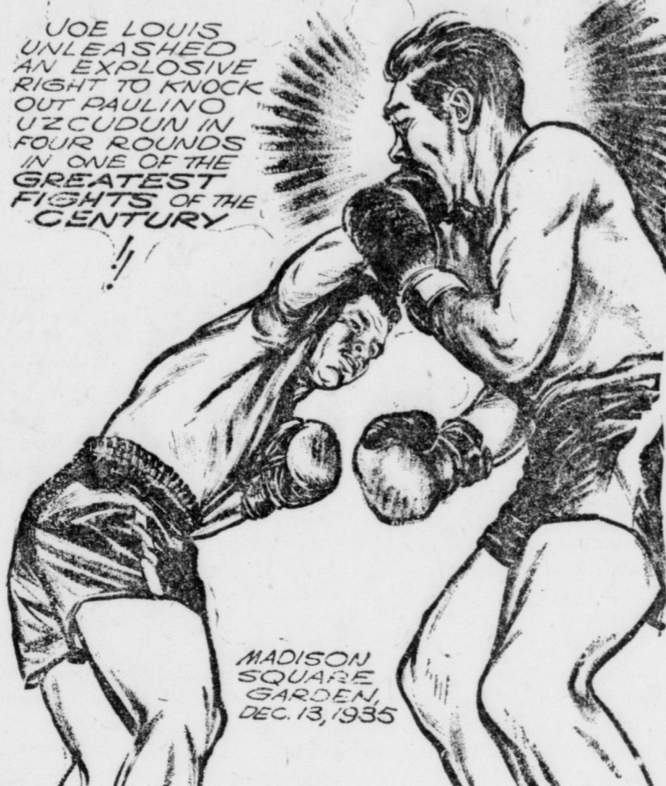

Penna. Game Commission Weekly Letter

The recent deer season for archers probably netted bowmen fewer deer than did a similar two-week season in '53 when 84 legal bucks were taken. The kill figure for this year is not yet available, however, because tags of several known kills have not been received in the Harrisburg Office of the Game Commission to date.

The authorities remind successful bow and arrow hunters that big game kill reports are required, by law, in Penna.

Careless Shooting
So-called hunting gun accidents and disregard for the law have caused many persons in Pennsylvania to lose their hunting privilege for a period of years.

At referees' hearings, conducted by the Game Commission, it has been evident that a large number of casualties were due to the negligent handling of guns while loading or unloading. Many such "accidents" occurred in camps following hunts or in autos in which loaded firearms were carried.

Recently, lists of hunters' names and addresses whose hunting privileges have been denied for a number of years were sent to all license issuing agents over the state.

Since the middle of May, 1044 persons received legal notice that under existing provisions of law their valued privilege of taking wild birds or animals in Pennsylvania had been revoked for the period stated on the notice. These license revocations resulted from dangerous, lawless or vandalistic acts committed by hunters in this state last year, before or during the principal fall and winter hunting or trapping seasons, and into August, 1954.

The majority of the revocations were for one to three years

duration, dependent on the seriousness of the violation committed. Repeat violators were more severely punished than first offenders. However, some of the hunting license denials came from misdemeanor cases - shooting at, wounding or killing a human in mistake for game. In such cases district court judges, in addition to other penalties imposed, often ruled that hunting and trapping privileges be revoked for as long as ten years.

The Game Commission issues these facts and figures hoping to reduce hunter casualties and to discourage serious violations of the game law.

Grouse Depression Ahead
It looks as if Pennsylvania hunters may have to be content with a few less ruffed grouse in the forest this fall. For the past two years Michigan and other mid-western states have noted a decline in the numbers of this bird and have attributed this reduction to the grouse cycle. This unexplained but well-known cycle causes these birds to increase greatly in numbers, only to fall off to a low, and then increase all over again every ten years. The appearance of the down-swing of the cycle moves from west to east, and Pennsylvania usually lags a year or so behind the more western states.

Each year the 150 District Game Protectors in Penna. record all of the broods of young grouse, wild turkeys, ring-necked pheasants, and bobwhite quail they see during the spring and summer. Ruffed grouse brood counts in 1954 indicated that hunting for the "thunder-bird" this fall may not be as good as in 1953. The Protectors saw fewer broods and smaller broods this year. But the count even as late as August, and field observations since, shows that there will still be plenty of birds in the best spots. In the meantime hunters will have to keep their fingers crossed for next year.
