Hampshires at this world's greatest livestock exhibition will be judged on Wednesday, Dec. 1.

Other highlights held in conjunction with the Exposition are the 32nd International Grain and Hay Show, the International Wool Show, the International sheep shearing contests, and 4 judging contests that will attract both 4-H and college teams from a majority of the states.

In addition to the 9 evening performances, matinee Horse Shows will be presented on Sunday, Nov. 28, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and the final Saturday, Dec. 4.

NATION WIDE S-D DAY CAMPAIGN

One 24-hour period when, throughout the nation, there will be no highway accidents, fatalities, or injuries is the goal of Safe Driving Day, which has been scheduled for December 14 by the President's Committee for Traffic Safety. To prepare motorists and pedestrians for the test day, an intensive educational campaign will be launched on Nov. 15, using all available channels for distributing information in the United States.

The objective of Safe Driving Day, to be called S-D Day, is to provide a graphic demonstration that highway accidents can be virtually eliminated if all drivers and pedestrians do their part to make the nation's thoroughfares safe.

The President's Action Committee has asked each Governor to proclaim December 15th as S-D Day; designate a State S-D Day director; and request Mayors and Burgesses to designate local S-D Day directors. In addition, civic and other organizations will be asked to develop special programs in line with the country-wide project.

A primary purpose of the S-D Day campaign will be to emphasize that the initial place to attack the traffic safety problem is in the local community and the responsibility must rest with the individual. With this in view both motorists and pedestrians will be asked to observe the letter and the spirit of all traffic regulations on S-D Day.
