### Special Services Beginning Sunday At St. Luke's

Special Advent services will be held in St. Luke's Episcopal Church beginning with the first Sunday in Advent, Nov. 28, and continue for two Sundays following. Services will begin at 4 P. M. Extra numbers on the organ will be played by David E. Schlosser, organist of the Church. Miss Helen Stanley, vocalist of Reading will appear as the guest soloist on the first Sunday, Miss Stanley is well known in the musical circles of Reading appearing in many churches and in the Reading Civic Opera as soloist.

Talks on the Episcopal Church will be given by the Rev. Emmert M. Moyer, Vicar. The discussions will be on the History, Doctrine, Ministry, Sacraments and Symbolism of the Church. Vital questions concerning the Episcopal Church will be answered such as, when, where, and how did the Church originate? Why are vestments, candles, incense used in the services? Why pray out of a Book? Is the Church liberal about sin? Is the Church Protestant or Catholic? and others.

A fellowship hour will follow the services in the Parish room at which time light refreshments will be served and motion pictures of the Episcopal church at work will be shown. "In Fertile Soil" will be shown November 28. This film vividly presents many of the challenges facing the church in Town and Country areas today and how the Episcopal church endeavors to meet these challenges. "Strength of the Hills" is scheduled for Dec. 5. This film tells the story of the Church's work among the Sioux Indians of S. Dakota. "Light of the North" will be shown Dec. 12. This is a portrayal of the Alaskan church in action. The story follows Bishop Gordon as he makes his visitations to Indian and Eskimo missions, servicemen, and to the churches in Alaska's busy cities. The public is cordially invited to attend these services.

### Florin Church Plans Missionary Symposium

The Glossbrenner Evangelical United Brethren Church of Florin, will hold its annual Missionary Symposium Nov. 25, 26, 27 & 28. Last year (Nov. 1953) the congregation voted to build a parsonage in West Africa at a cost of \$2800. It was expected that the local church would complete the payment of the project in two years. Now it is planned that the final payment will be made at the end of Nov. 1954, instead of 1955.

The building in Africa is being erected in honor of Dr. and Mrs. John F. Musselman, who for nearly 40 years served in Africa as missionaries. Dr. Musselman is a son of the local church.

The program for the occasion will begin with a Thanksgiving Day breakfast on Nov. 25 at 7 A. M., sponsored by the Brotherhood of the Church. Mr. Tatsuo Hoshino and Mrs. Masaka Kato, Japan will be the guests to speak and sing. In the evening our Japanese guests will again speak and sing. There will be also a film entitled "Africa, a Continent of Hope and Opportunity."

On Friday evening, Nov. 26 at 7:30 P. M. Miss Florence Barnhart, a returned missionary from Africa, will speak. A film entitled "In the Valley of the Rio Grande" will be shown. On Saturday evening, Nov. 27, 7:30 P. M., the Rev. and Mrs. Eugene Wenger, recently returned from missionary work in Japan, will speak. The Symposium concludes with the program of Sunday, Nov. 28. In the 10:30 A. M. Service, by Dr. V. P. Hovermale Executive Secretary of Home Missions in the Evangelical U. B. Church with offices in Dayton, Ohio will be the guest speaker. In the evening the Symposium will close with first a supper sponsored by the Youth Fellowship and then a message in the evening service 7:15 P. M. Rev. Carew, a native of West Africa and delegate from that country to the General Conference held in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

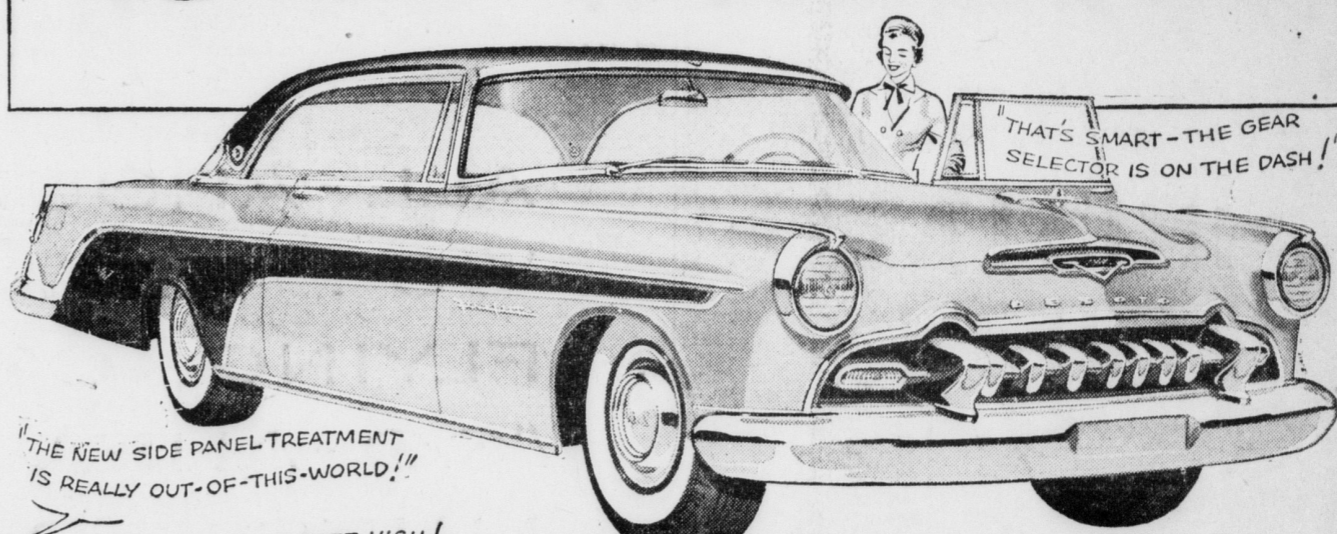

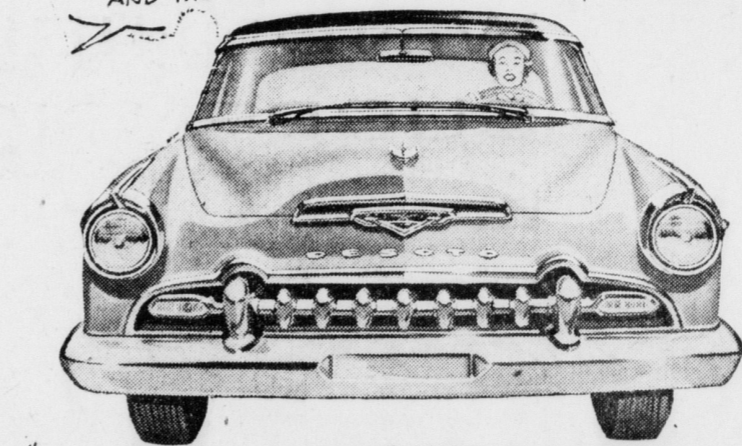

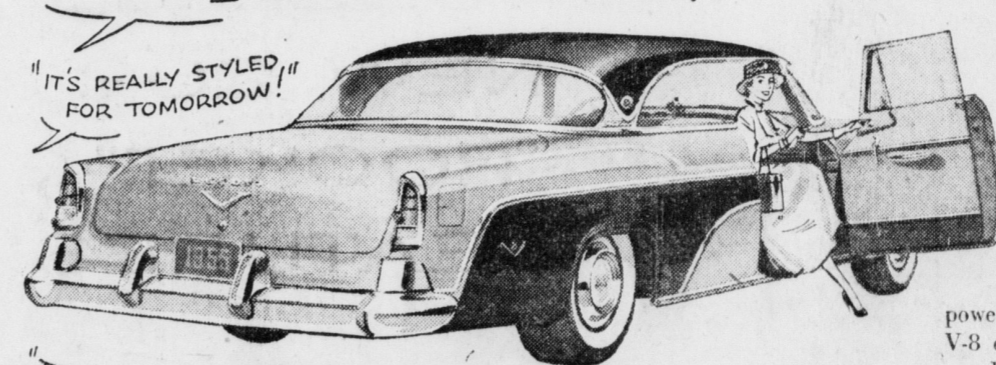
