

A big dish of succulent Sauerkraut and Pork Hocks is a sure-hit with the men in the family. Both the sauerkraut and pork hocks (or knuckles) are easy on the food pennies.

If your family prefers another vegetable instead of sauerkraut, canned greens, or green and wax beans are seasoned to perfection with pork hocks. Cook the meat slowly and add the vegetables a few minutes before serving. Where time is an element, cook the hocks the night before serving and store in the refrigerator. Serve fluffy mashed fore or in the morning and store in the refrigerator. Serve fluffy mashed potatoes, canned spiced peaches or apricots, and a crisp salad to round out the main course. Sauerkraut and Pork Hocks
