Timely Reminders from The Pennsylvania State University College of Agriculture

Provide Diets — More farm families have adequate diets than do rural nonfarm families, according to a survey in the north central part of the country.

Save Toddler — Keep your toddler from danger's door. Store detergents, poisons, cleaning fluids, and barbiturates where he cannot find them.

Treat Strains — Permanent strains on rugs can usually be avoided if the spot is treated at once. Soak up liquids with a clean absorbent cloth.

Pep Up Pot Roast — A seasoning that lends itself well to pot roast is curry powder. About 45 minutes before the meat is done, mix 1 tablespoon curry powder and 1 teaspoon sugar with one-half cup water.

Ground Machine — For safety's sake your washing machine should be "grounded." A wire attached with a clamp to the leg of the machine and clamped to a cold water pipe will do the job.

Orangeade Used To Extinguish Blaze

Mount Joy firemen were called out at 4:00 a.m. Wednesday morning to the home of Abram Rinehart, Mount Joy Street. A fire of unknown origin was confined to an unused studio couch which was located in the backyard beside a garage.

Joseph Schroll, who was delivering milk at the time, reported the fire but managed to extinguish it with orangeade before firemen arrived. In addition to the couch, a portion of the door of the garage burned.

The Mount Joy Friendship Fire Company was called out the second time Wednesday when they extinguished a fire in a tobacco shed on the farm owned by Mrs. Fannie Weidman located on the Mount Joy-Manheim road at 4:45 p. m.

Since there was no one home, the fire was discovered by a neighbor, Samuel Merkel.

The damage was estimated at \$150.00 since the fire which started from a spark from a stove in the stripping room ignited a pile of wood located beside the stove. The wood burned a hole 6x8 feet in the floor and the fire dropped to the basement. Firemen were able to confine the fire to that area. The local chief, Ray Myers, also had called in the Florin Fire Company.

TREE DEDICATION HELD

A tree was planted and a marker placed before it at the Glenn Martin-Kenneth Raber Memorial Service and Tree Dedication Sunday afternoon at the Donegal High School. The two main speakers for the special service were the two boys' ministers, The Rev. B. E. Thuma, Bishop of the Donegal District of the Brethren in Christ Church and the Rev. Wilbur Allison, pastor of the Maytown Lutheran Church. Both were killed in accidents last year.

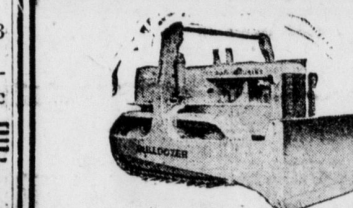
