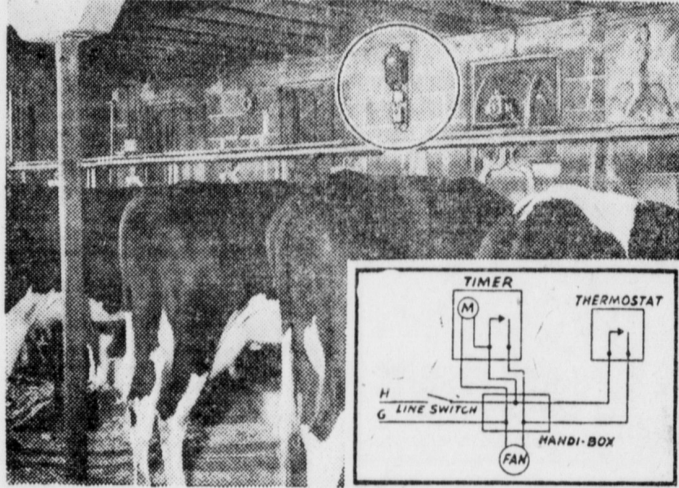

New Type of Ventilation System Timer, Thermostat Give "Double Protection"

No agricultural engineer will question the value of electric ventilation in dairy barns. For, proper ventilation eliminates excessive moisture condensation which causes a variety of troubles. Trapped moisture accumulates under metal roofs and around nails, rusting both. Also,

ventilation. As long as the temperature is above the thermostat setting, the fan runs constantly, exhausting warm, moist air. When the temperature drops below 55, the fan stops. The timer cuts in at that point to re-operate the fan for brief intervals every 10 minutes until the temperature rises again to 55, when the thermostat once more takes over

it may cause paint to blister and peel off, and walls and window sills to deteriorate.

Where engineers differ is on the type of system required. Usually this is due to experience with installations which have been "tried and proved" by them in their respective areas. The electric fans in the systems we have described in the past are controlled by thermostats only. Now, we've come across one which employs a timer as well as a thermostat to provide what has been called "double protection."

This latest system uses only one fan, and this is located at ceiling level with a duct leading to within 15 inches of the floor. In unheated buildings, the timer and thermostat are connected in parallel, as will be noted by the diagram inset in the above picture.

In operation, the thermostat is set at 55 degrees. This insures maximum

the ventilation chore. Regular timer operation of the fan provides minimum ventilation requirements. Moisture-laden air is replaced with clean outside air, and not enough heat is removed to cool off the building.

To determine the timer setting, multiply each 1,000 pounds of animal weight by 250, then divide the product by the cubic feet per minute (CFM) rating of the fan. The resulting number is the timer setting, as based on minimum requirements of 25 CFM per cow. The manufacturer suggests that the fan used have a capacity of 200 CFM per 1,000 pounds of animal weight. He reasons that a large size fan will provide better ventilation in warm weather. In the winter its exhaust properties can be controlled by shutters in the duct to reduce the air outlet to from 60 to 120 CFM per minute in areas where this is recommended.

State Farm Show Has Record Entry

Harrisburg — W. S. Hagar, secretary of Agriculture and chairman of the State Farm Show Commission, today announced that an all-time record total of horses, sheep, swine, dairy and beef cattle has been entered for the 1955 Pennsylvania Farm Show here next January 10-14.

The total of 2,165 compares with 2,075 in advance entries for the 1954 Farm Show, an increase of 90 over the old record he said.

Standing as an accurate reflection of the importance of the State's largest single agricultural industry, the dairy cattle department has the largest number

of entries, 754 compared with 670 head at the last show.

Beef cattle entries also are at record high, a total of 454, including 130 head of 4-H Club baby beefs, Secretary Hagar said. This is 55 more than the number entered for the 1954 show. Breeds include Aberdeen-Angus, Hereford and Shorthorn.

Swine entries, total 402 head, six below the advance entries made for the 1954 show. Sheep at 505 head are down from the 549 entered for the last show.

The 1955 Farm Show will have 90 head of horses on display and in competition for place awards and cash premiums. This is an increase of 31 head.

In anticipation of greater competition this year the Farm Show Commission has provided a record livestock premium offering of \$34,188. This total is \$5,000 greater than the last show.

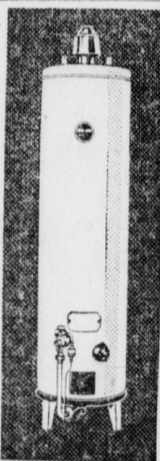
SENTENCED

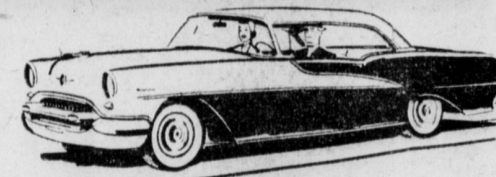
