### MORE PHYSICIANS FOR RURAL AREAS

More doctors for more rural areas is the objective of a program being initiated this month and jointly sponsored by the Committee on Rural Health and Physician Placement of The Medical Society of the State of Pennsylvania and the Penna. State University. More than 1,000 questionnaires are being mailed to rural practitioners in an endeavor to determine the personal, social, and economic problems and advantages of medical practice in rural areas.

"There are at the moment only eight rural areas in critical need of a physician," declared Dr. C. L. Palmer, of Pittsburgh, chairman of the Committee, "and these are being considered and aided as rapidly as possible. There are other areas that do not have physicians but are not in dire need of such services. However, we hope by this study and follow-up to see to it that every section of Pennsylvania is adequately covered by physician-service."

### BANKS PLAY IMPORTANT ROLE IN FARM ECONOMY

"3 billion 800 million dollars in farm loans to farmers help make us the best fed country in the world!" This is the message of the latest project prepared by the Pennsylvania Bankers Association in honor of the State Farm Show which is being held in Harrisburg, Jan. 10-14.

The message, being carried by banks across the state through folders and posters, sets forth figures on bank services to farmers. It emphasizes the fact that the nation's banks are the leading source of agricultural credit, and shows that everyone benefits from bank credit to the farmers.

Recent figures show that 94% of all insured commercial banks in the United States make loans to farmers. This means that many city banks join county banks in extending agricultural credit.
