



This pretty-as-a-picture dish 1 1/8 teaspoon ground cloves 2 center slices of ham, 1/2-inch thick 2 tablespoons honey

> Combine rice and butter and toss lightly with a fork until butter is melted. Add oranges, apples, raisins, brown sugar, and cloves. Spread in 10x6x2-inch baking pan.

> Cut ham into six pieces, and place over dressing. Brush with honey. Cover. Bake in moderate oven (350°F.) about 45 minutes, until apples are tender and ham


