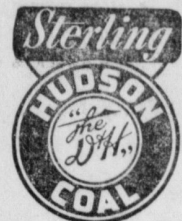

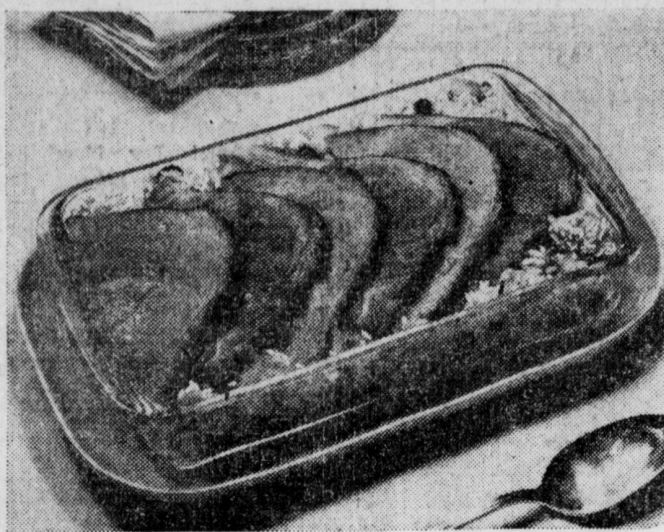

**HAM WITH FRUIT-RICE DRESSING**



This pretty-as-a-picture dish looks festive enough for your company dinner, but it's so easy to prepare—and so delicious, too—you will want your family to have it often.

- 2 cups hot cooked rice
- 1 tablespoon butter or margarine
- 1 cup orange segments (2 medium oranges)
- 1 small tart apple, diced (1 1/2 cups)
- 1/4 cup seedless raisins
- 3 tablespoons brown sugar

- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 2 center slices of ham, 1/2-inch thick
- 2 tablespoons honey

Combine rice and butter and toss lightly with a fork until butter is melted. Add oranges, apples, raisins, brown sugar, and cloves. Spread in 10x6x2-inch baking pan.

Cut ham into six pieces, and place over dressing. Brush with honey. Cover. Bake in moderate oven (350°F.) about 45 minutes, until apples are tender and ham is glazed. Yield: 6 servings.



**Society For Crippled Children Elects Officers**

Lancaster County Society for Crippled Children and Adults, Inc. at its annual meeting Monday elected Walter C. Miller president. Other officers chosen are: Dr. John B. Noss, vice president; Miss Lucile Brackbill, secretary; J. Andrew Frantz, treasurer.

Re-elected to the board of directors are: Mrs. William G. Johnstone Jr., Miss Lucile Brackbill, J. Andrew Frantz, Dr. John B. Noss, and Daniel Rhoads.

Speaker was Fred Weibel, civic leader of Allentown and an outstanding figure in crippled children's work. He emphasized that the chief satisfaction that comes from work for crippled children lies in the knowledge that "you are creating a brighter future and happier life for them. You not only give them treatment, but try to widen their small horizons, get them out of their homes into the world and try to help them find a place in society."

"The thank-you in a smile, or the grasp of a hand, or the look in an eye, is often more expressive than the spoken one," Weibel said, adding that, "Handicapped people do more for us than we do for them. They help us measure our own lives so that we build a monument of ourselves in their hearts. The future will not remember us for our thrift, but for our generosity, of time and effort while we are living. What you really take with you are the things you gave given away."

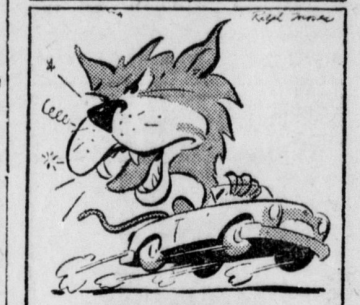

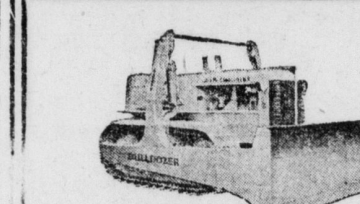
