# CAPTAIN KID STUFF

(OR... JOHN'S MISTAKE)

John was growing up. (He shaved. He drove a car. He wanted to impress girls.) But John was impatient. He wanted to be more grown-up. He wanted a grown-up reputation. In short, he wanted to make a name for himself. That's natural. Most young men his age feel the same way. But John made a mistake. He expressed his impatience and his ambition behind the wheel of a car.

He became another "highway cowboy." He purposely drove fast... didn't use chains on snow or ice... skidded... took chances... raced on crowded streets. He thought this would make him seem more grown-up. But the gang could see through his antics. They gave him a name all right—"Captain Kid Stuff." They were smart enough to know that Careless Driving is Kid Stuff.



### THE SIX RULES OF WINTER DRIVING

1. ACCEPT YOUR RESPONSIBILITY. Do all in your power to drive without accident. Don't blame the weatherman for an accident.
2. GET THE "FEEL" OF THE ROAD. Try brakes occasionally while driving slowly and away from traffic. Find out just how slippery the road is and adjust your speed to road and weather conditions.
3. KEEP THE WINDSHIELD CLEAR of snow and ice, fog and frost. Be sure headlights, windshield wiper blades and defrosters are in top condition.
4. USE TIRE CHAINS AND GOOD TIRES. Don't rely on worn smooth tires. Use tire chains on snow and ice. They cut stopping distances about half, give 4 to 7 times more starting and climbing traction ability. But even with the help of chains, slower than normal speeds are a "must" on snow and ice.
5. PUMP YOUR BRAKES to slow down or stop. Jamming them on can lock the wheels and throw you into a dangerous skid. A little skidding can carry you a long way.
6. FOLLOW AT A SAFE DISTANCE. Keep well back of the vehicle ahead—give yourself room to stop. Remember, without tire chains, it takes 3 to 12 times as far to stop on snow and ice as on dry concrete.

### New Eyes For Needy

In 1932 the late Mrs. Arthur Terry worked as a volunteer in a New York City Red Cross Food Station. There she found men and women who could not see to sign their names and could not afford to buy glasses. She was determined to help these poor human beings deprived of the primitive joy of sight. At first, she gave them discarded glasses begged from friends. Then one day, seeing the gleam of gold in frames, her idea was born.

The plan she worked out was extraordinarily simple. Old eyeglasses, odd bits of jewelry, gold and silver scrap could be melted down to provide funds for new prescription glasses.

As Mrs. Terry's idea developed the Junior Service League of Short Hills assisted in the work, and after her death in 1947, the Service League incorporated New Eyes For The Needy as a non-profit charitable organization and made itself responsible for carrying on her project.

In response to appeals, packages pour into Short Hills. They are opened and the contents are carefully sorted by volunteers. The metal frames and gold and silver are sent to a refiner. The plastic glasses are set aside for future use.

With the funds obtained from the refiner, New Eyes purchases new prescription glasses and artificial eyes for the needy. This is done by establishments funds with hospitals in many major cities. Other hospitals and welfare agencies specify their annual requirements of glasses and receive payment for these from New Eyes funds. Any other hospital or accredited agency may receive assistance for purchase of glasses upon request. Any individual may apply directly to New Eyes for glasses and after their need has been certified, New Eyes pays for the prescribed glasses.

The plastic glasses set aside are classified according to their various categories. Simple magnifying and nearsighted glasses, sunglasses, cataract glasses and good frames are distributed for reuse through hospitals, missions and welfare organizations at home and as far away as the Philippines, India and Africa.

Up to 1953 New Eyes has helped more than 75,000 people to better sight. The demand on New Eyes is ever increasing. **Handy Jim's FIX-UP TIPS For farm and Home**

**Masonite Wastebasket Simple to Make**

EVERY man should have a wastebasket, and some rooms should have two! Making one or several from the plan here described and illustrated is an easy test of an amateur craftsman's skill.

From a lumber yard obtain some three-quarter-inch quarter-round and a panel of Masonite Tempered Presdwood one-eighth inch thick. With a cross-cut saw, cut from the panel four

identical pieces for the sides and a smaller one for the bottom. The side pieces are 12 inches long and tapered from a top width of 10 inches to a bottom width of 8 inches. An 8-inch square serves as the bottom.

The panels are nailed to the quarter-rounds serving as corner posts. At the bottom of each side piece attach a length of quarter-round to form a square framework into which the bottom may be nailed.

Hand holds may be cut out, as illustrated, with a coping or similar saw. To start the blade, drill a hole.

As a variation from this style, use the same sized sides and bottom, lacing instead of nailing the sides together. No quarter-rounds then are needed, except as a base for the bottom. Drill holes about an inch apart and a half-inch from the edge. Use leather thong or lacing.
