Donegal Wins Title

Senior Jay Metzler paced Donegal with 25 points Friday night as the Green and White scored a 55-33 victory over Columbia High before a record crowd of 1700 at Donegal high school. This victory gave Donegal its first league title. Columbia, who has one of the fastest teams in the league, featured an all-court press, and came within an eyelash of scoring the upset of the season.

Donegal started at a slow pace and was unable to build up a comfortable lead, holding a 6-point edge at the first and second

quarter. In the third period, Donegal began to pull away, and at one time enjoyed a 14-point lead, but at the close of the third period, Columbia narrowed it to 6 points again. In the fourth quarter, Columbia kept picking away until they finally tied the score.

At this point the Green and White managed to take a five-point lead, with 40 seconds remaining to play. Columbia, trailing by two points, managed to gain possession of the ball and took numerous shots at the basket failing to score, and as the

buzzer sounded ending the game, Gerfin was fouled. This was Columbia's chance to tie the score and send the game into an overtime period, but after a matter of minutes to clear the floor of joyous Donegal rooters, the Columbia senior missed both tries. Final score, 55-53.

Metzler and Ashenfelter were leading scorers for Donegal, and Kauffman and Carey were high for Columbia.

In winning the Section One title, Donegal will face Manheim Township, Feb. 22, at McCaskey High School Lancaster.

Over \$300,000 Spent In Lancaster County Polio Fight

The National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, together with its Lancaster Chapter, spent a total of \$305,286.56 for polio patient care and prevention during 1954 here on Lancaster county.

This staggering expenditure was announced by Christian C. Rudy, chairman of the local polio chapter, as he made a strong appeal to '55 March of Dimes & Dollars to help the local polio appeal for continued late returns, organization to reach its \$85,000 goal.

Rudy said that according to the State Department of Health, 53,930 cubic centimeters of gamma globulin, the preventative blood drug, were administered in Lancaster county through the county medical director's office. This gamma globulin - valued at \$177,969 - was paid for by the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis.

In addition, the Lancaster County Chapter expended a total of \$127,317.55 for patient care, research allocations, rehabilitation expenses and for the purchase of polio equipment necessary in the care of polio victims.
