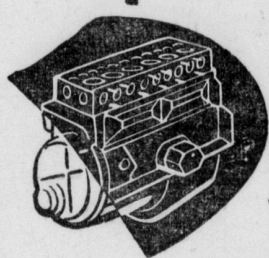

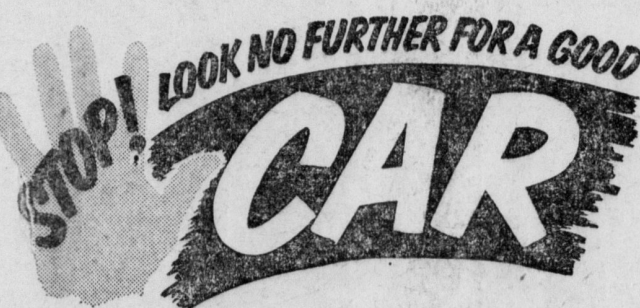

Interest Increasing In Methods Of Soil Conservation

The two wagon shed meetings held recently at the farm of Andrew H. Hackman and LeRoy Geib's Feed Store in Rapho Township were well attended in spite of the cold weather. The following farmers requested that the Lancaster County Soil Conservation District supply a technician to work with them to provide a workable plan of conservation for their farms: Jay Buckwalter, Abram Faus, Henry Hoffer, and Wilbur I. Stoner.

Farmers are becoming more conscious of the need for maintaining and improving the soil for the general health and security of the American people. All people are benefactors when the proper practices are applied in accordance to the capabilities and needs of the soil. Soils may be made more or less productive through concern or neglect. Neglected soils increase cost of production with decreased yields while soils properly managed reduce production cost with increased yields.

Improved varieties of seeds and efficient and modern farm machinery have been accepted but in too many cases farmers have failed to adjust their operation to a pattern of contour strips. Progressive agriculture always demands the application of those principles that have been proven to be superior from actual farm practice.

Contour strip farming is evidenced in the community of new horizons in agriculture. These farmers catch the spirit of the pioneer and move forward with a new vision as to what they can do for the soil and what the soil will do for them and the larger segment of society that the land nourishes.

Think it over Mr. Farmer. You can't make it rain but you can keep as much as 40 per cent of the rain from running from your fields and creating cancerous gullies. You can't make new soil but you can save and improve what you have. Why not make the decision to be a good steward of the soil and contract your soil Conservation District for help? All information and suggestions to help you are free. Call your director and request him to come to your farm to talk it over with you. The directors are: Amos Funk, Millersville; Harry Metzler, Lancaster; Lemon Weist, Ephrata; Elmer Good, Litzitz, and Henry H. Hackman, Manheim.
