**Mount Joy Church of God To Sponsor E-town A Capella Choir Program**

The A Cappella Choir of the Elizabethtown College will sing in the Mount Joy Church of God Wednesday evening, Mar. 9. The choir is being sponsored in the church by the Ergatan Sunday School class. Proceeds from the program will go toward the church building fund.

Nevin W. Fisher is the director of the forty mixed voices; and Donald Golden is organist-accompanist. More than half the group are vocal soloists. This year marks the 20th anniversary year of the founding of the organization. The group is singing concerts in churches, high schools and civic auditoriums from Johnstown to Philadelphia.

Soloists appearing with the choir will be Marilyn Longenecker, soprano, Lebanon; Gloria Gladfelter, mezzo-soprano, New Cumberland; and Paul Rice, baritone, Waynesboro.

Special numbers the group will sing at the local church included in the six part program are "Sing Praises, God So Loved the World, Praise God in His Holiness and Gloria in Excelsis Deo", part 1; Women's double quartette, part 2; "In Excelsis Gloria, Galilean Easter Coral, Hear My Prayer, O Lord and The Almighty", part 3.

"Listen to the Lambs, Dark Water, Ain't a That Good News and I'm in His Care, part 4; the College Men's Quartette, part 5 and "I May Not Climb the Heights, How Firm a Foundation and Preludes to Eternity, part 6.

Two local men appear with the group. Ross Eshleman, Florin is one of the five first basses and Warren Bates, Landisville is one of five second tenors.

The program in the Church of God next Wednesday is scheduled to begin at 7:45 p. m. This marks the second appearance of the group in Mount Joy. They made their first appearance in the Church of God, last spring.
