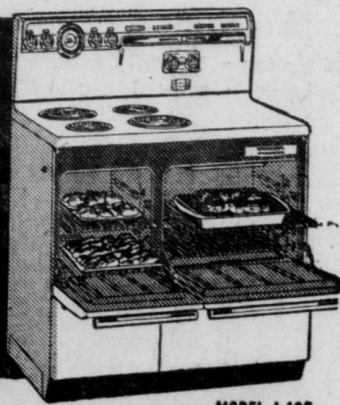

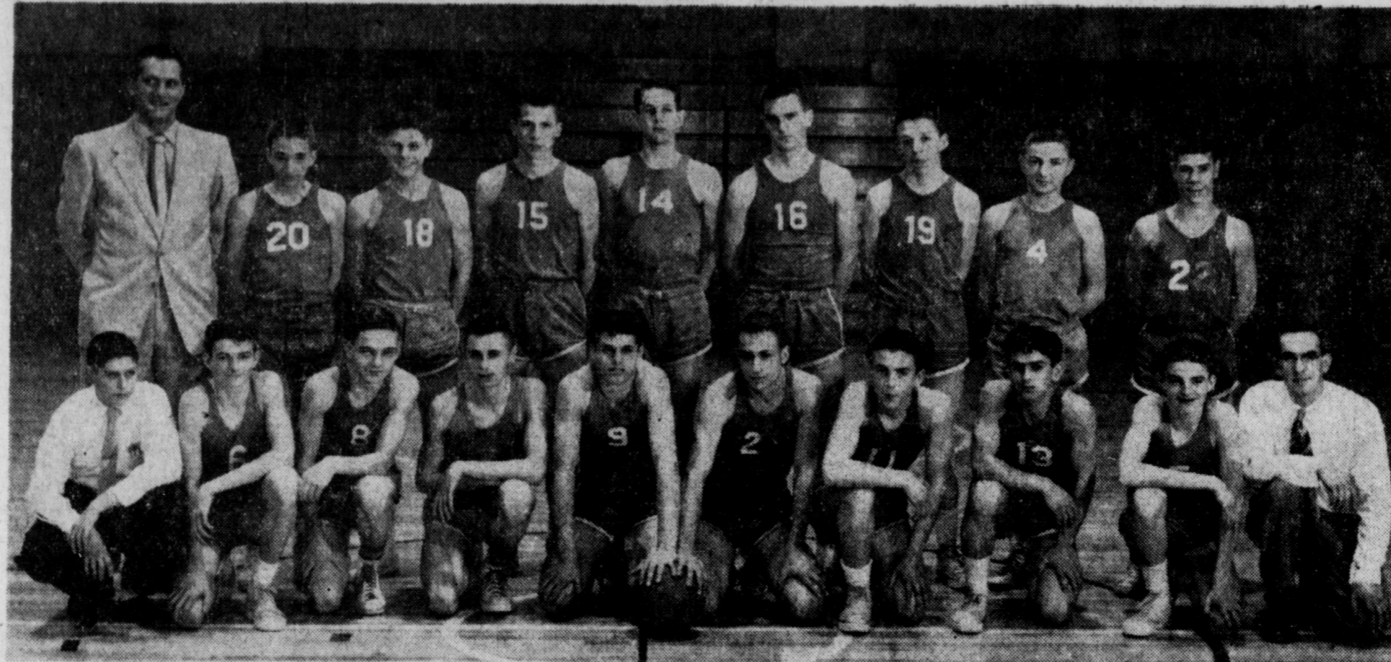

Parties Set Up Platforms At Donegal High

Registration was held at the Donegal High School Tuesday in connection with the Mt. Joy JayCee sponsored "Youth Day in Government" project. Monday, Norman Garber, chairman of the project for the JayCeers, explained the program to the student body.

Registration was conducted in the various homerooms at which time students registered for either the Green or the White Party.

Each party produced a platform. Highlights of the Green Party's platform are: 1. To plan the establishment of a wholesome recreation program for each lunch period; 2. To work to improve the service in the cafeteria; 3. To provide new uniforms for the junior varsity and junior high basketball teams and the junior varsity cheerleaders; 4. To work with the present newspaper staff to have a commercially printed newspaper; 5. To provide for more efficiency and greater safety, a "hall traffic code"; 6. to use at games and at lunch-time, the placement of vending machines of chocolate milk, orange drink, and crackers; 7. provide for the advancement of the physical education department with the construction of an indoor and outdoor swimming pool. For the area, the Green Party advocates the construction of a recreation center to benefit all three towns; establish a church basketball league and baseball league; support legislation to provide new roads in the area; erect an all purpose stadium at the rear of the school for the athletic teams.

Highlights of the White Party include: 1. More and better lunch hour activities; 2. More field trips for everyday teaching; 3. More heat during those cold winter months; 4. An allowance of one half day off for playoffs; 5. More activities for girls; 6. More practical teaching; 7. A more intelligent report card system; 8. few and lesser taxes; 9. Saving the lawns by reconstructing the driveways; 10. construction of a swimming pool and athletic field; 11. Better water and water system; and 12. More and better physical education classes.
