ELIZA CAMERON BRADLEY Mrs. Eliza Cameron Bradley, 98, who died last Wednesday at her home, 407 N. Front Street, Harrisburg, maintained the Cameron estate at Donegal Springs where she and a sister, Miss Mary Cameron, usually spent the months from May to Thanksgiving.

Mrs. Bradley, widow of William H. Bradley, former Newark, N. J. attorney, was a member of one of Harrisburg's oldest families.

Mrs. Bradley was a member of the Presbyterian Church and attended the Pine Street Church in Harrisburg and Donegal Springs Church. She was interested for many years in the preservation of the historic Donegal Church and was a member of the executive committee of the Donegal Society the past decade.

She was born March 6, 1957, eldest child of the late Sen. J. Donald Cameron, who served as Secretary of War in President Ulysses S. Grant's cabinet. Her mother was the late Mary McCormick. As a young woman Mrs. Bradley made frequent visits to Washington with her father and her grandfather, the late Senator Simon Cameron, who served in Lincoln's cabinet. She was the last surviving cabinet hostess of the Grant Administration.

Following her husband's death in 1889 Mrs. Bradley returned to Harrisburg to live with her sister. In addition to her sister, Miss Mary Cameron, Mrs. Bradley is survived by a son, Joseph Gardner Bradley, Boston; a sister, Mrs. Chadler Hale, Washington; four grandchildren, and 11 great-grandchildren.
