Y-W Centennial Fund At \$33,000; \$75,000 Is Needed

The Lancaster Young Women's Christian Association joins associations all over the world in celebrating the 100th anniversary of the World's Y.W.C.A. The first prayer groups in England in 1885 for girls in industry were soon followed by similar groups in New York. As girls entered factories to work, offices to type, cities to live in instead of small towns, in the 1890's, they became the concern of Christian women. So dormitories for safe living, classes for instruction in new skills, (for example type-writing), calisthenics to keep well, cafeterias to eat well on small budgets, followed one another to make what we know now as the Y.W.C.A.

Some work with teen-age girls (called then Girl Reserves) and young adults (called Industrial Girls) began and to these has recently been added a co-educational program. Boys and girls, young men and women now find in YWCA's fellowship and recreation. The latest additions include newcomers as they enter a community and Y-wives with a day of their own planning and tiny-tots swim periods.

To house this program in Lancaster the present building at Orange and Lime streets was built in 1917.

In addition to the Y. W. clubs (nurses, homemakers, garden, newcomers, etc.) and to the classes (swimming, health education, Spanish, speech, English etc.) there are community groups who use the building regularly for meeting.

As the Lancaster Y. W. C. A. prepared to join the Centennial celebration and to raise its birthday gift for the National Board, the Community Chest of Lancaster County suggested that to this gift he added a drive to retire the mortgage (\$33,000 and a sum for basic building needs \$25,000). Retiring the mortgage will save contributor to the Community Chest \$1,300 annually.

The building at the end of a generation needs basic repairs. Maintenance alone is provided in the yearly budget, 50 percent of which is supplied by the Red Feather Drive.

This is the first capital drive in a generation that the YWCA has put on in the community. The list of things needed in the building begins with rehabilitation of the dumb-waiter so that the janitors need not carry trunks and trash to and from all four floors of Kepler Hall (the Residence); a new floor for the gym when the next sanding is required, more office space, and conversion of the former cafeteria and kitchen to present uses. These and other requirements need the money that MUST be raised in this effort, beyond the year's budget.

There are on our rolls girls, women, boys, and young men from more than a score of county areas. They come to gym classes, to swim, for clubs, book reviews, as newcomers, for the Y-Wives Day, to live in the Residence until they are secure in a new job in town, or to join in the fun provided by Hang Out or Lounge.

As the Centennial Drive moves in to the county, Mrs. Burt R. Glidden, a former President of the Board, announces her aides and plans. Mrs. John M. Adams and Mrs. J. Shober Barr are assisting her with the key people in the areas listed below. These people are starting at once to tell the Y. W. story and to secure gifts for her Centennial Fund. The week of March 15th has been set aside for reports from all workers.

The Centennial Fund has reached \$33,000 from special gifts solicited in November and from Y. W. groups. The latter are still working to reach their goal of \$15,000. The total needed is \$75,000 from the community (city, Manheim and Lancaster Townships) and about 23 county areas, church groups and city clubs, and the groups within the Y. W.
