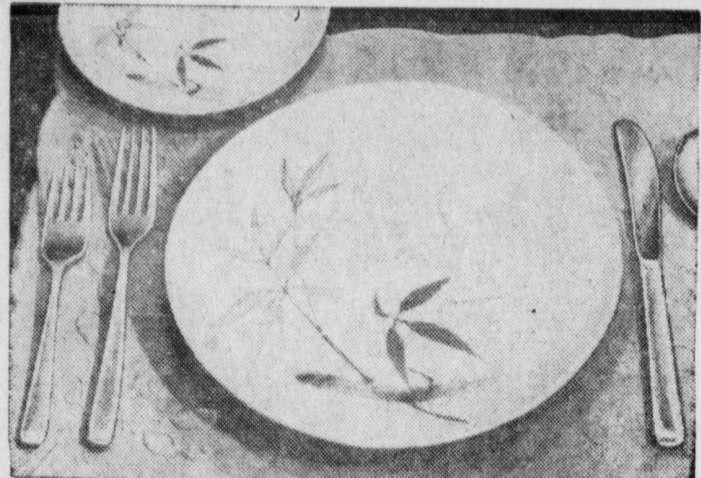

General Election Today At Donegal School

Charles Ashenfelter and John Hiestand were the candidates chosen by the green and white parties for governor of Donegal in the Youth Day in Government project at the High School primary elections last Thursday. Tomorrow the students vote in the general election at the school. During the past several weeks, each party set up its platform; the students registered; and rallies were held by the two parties. Last Thursday, the ninety-nine per cent registered students voted for their favorites on the primary tickets. Jack Sheaffer is faculty advisor for the project and Norman Garber, JayCee chairman.

Next Tuesday is Youth Day. The seven winning candidates of governor of Donegal, lieutenant governor, assessor, auditor, tax collector and two school board directors, will be escorted to Lancaster for the day. At 9:30 a. m., they will tour the county home; 10:30 a. m., the Water Works. All the winning candidates of the county schools will have luncheon at the Elks Club. At this luncheon, all the winning head office holders will make short talks. If conditions permit, another tour will follow the luncheon.

Also next Tuesday, the winning two representative to the capitol from each school will go to Harrisburg. In the morning, they will visit the legislature; have lunch in the capitol cafeteria and take a tour of the capitol in the afternoon.

Other candidates named on the Green party are James Grove, lieutenant governor, Barbara Martin and Peter Nissley, representatives to the capitol; Sara Jane Portner, auditor; Doris Groff, assessor; Agnes Rosenfeld; tax collector; Nancy Jo Detwiler and Jay Metzler, school directors.

Candidates for the White party other than governor include Marlin Miller, lieutenant governor; Patricia Hawthorne and Karleen Raffensperger, representatives to the capitol; James Kinsey, auditor; Jerry Linard, assessor; David Weidman, tax collector and Barbara Warfel and James Wittle, school directors.

Chest X-Ray Service Offered On March 26

The Tuberculosis Society will bring the chest x-ray to Elizabethtown on Saturday, Mar. 26. The trailer housing the equipment will be parked in the Square between 4 and 9 p. m., giving all adults an opportunity to "Check Your Chest". There is no need to undress and it will only take a few minutes which will be time well spent. A nominal fee of \$1. is asked from individuals who are able to pay. However, whenever necessary, the cost is met by the society.

The pictures are made on miniature film and are merely a screening device. A definite diagnosis of tuberculosis is not made on the basis of these films alone. Everybody who comes to the unit for an x-ray will be sent a confidential report card. If the screening film is unsatisfactory or further study indicated, an appointment will be given for the individual to have a large x-ray film. All cases of suspected tuberculosis and other abnormal conditions requiring medical care and treatment are referred to private physicians, or clinics who receive a complete report on each case.

A Dual protective service. Since success of any small film x-ray campaign depends on a good follow-up, the Society has developed a thorough system of free x-ray follow-up. This service is maintained the year round and offers a dual protective service. First, by finding unknown disease those infected are placed under treatment while the disease is in its early stage thus making their chance of cure greater and far less costly; second, their families and friends are protected, for Tuberculosis is spread by the sick to the well.

All adults, and particularly parents are urged to take advantage of the chest x-ray service. This program is aimed at finding unknown tuberculosis, however any other abnormal condition noted on the x-ray are reported. It has been pointed out that active tuberculosis is more often found in adults than in children under 15 years of age. Therefore, every adult is urged to have a chest x-ray during the campaign period.

It is fairly certain that a child who develops tuberculosis catches it from an adult, probably one in his immediate family. It seems best to prevent this by finding the hidden cases of tuberculosis among the adult population.

Arthur G. Zerphey, North Barbara Street, Mount Joy and Mrs. Frances R. Brian, Frederick Street, Mount Joy were named as jurors on the May 2 session of Common Pleas Court.

Tuberculosis is not hereditary but adults can be passing on tuberculosis germs to children as well as to other adults, not knowing that they have the disease in active form.

One of the greatest difficulties in controlling tuberculosis is the fact that the disease has no obvious symptoms in the early stages, and yet it is communicable at any stage. Parents should be particularly interested in the x-ray program to find unknown cases of tuberculosis its success will mean a safer family, a healthier community in which to raise their children.

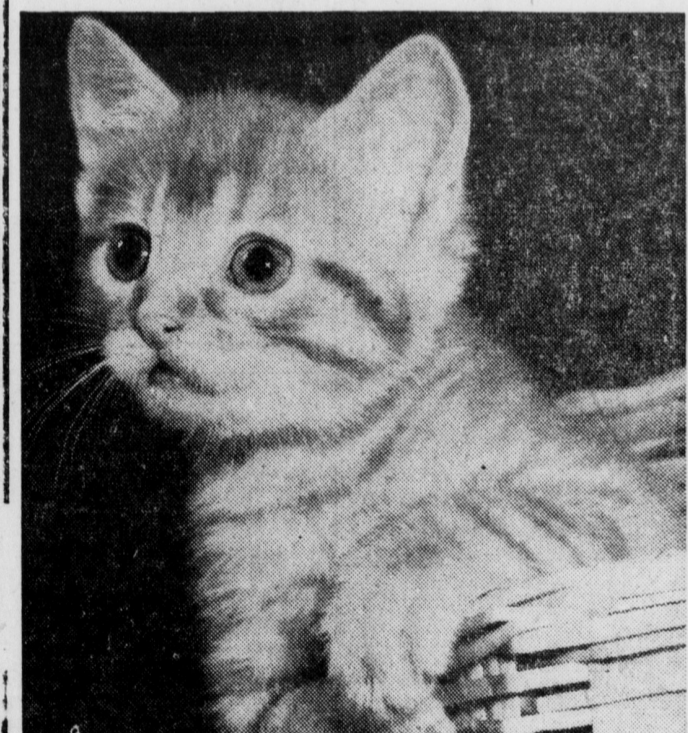

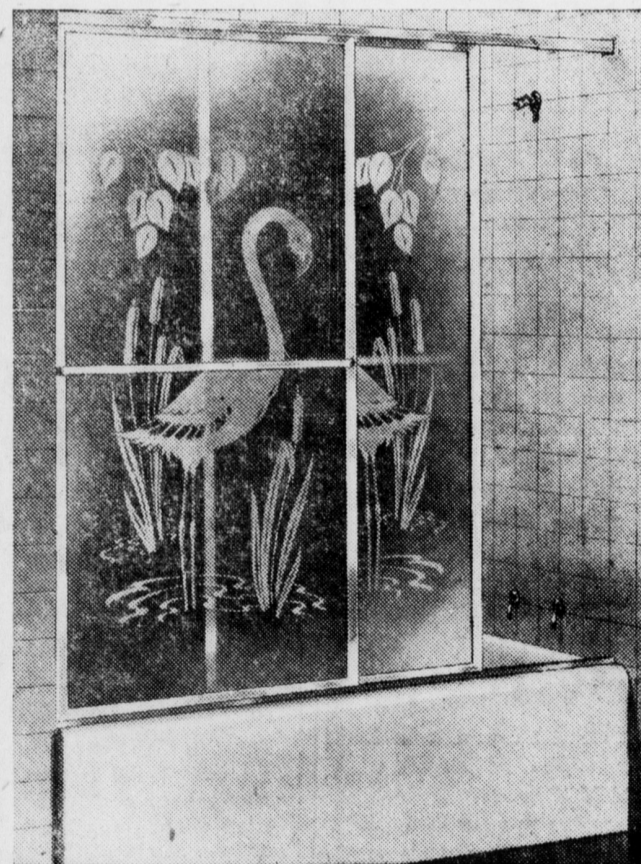
