## Farm Calendar

Timely Reminders from The Pennsylvania State University College of Agriculture

Buy Clean Seed — Certified seed is the farmer's best assurance of getting clean seed, free from weeds, according to George Berggren, Penn State extension agronomist. If certified seed is not used, the seed to be planted should be custom-cleaned or given a thorough cleaning at home with a properly equipped fanning mill.

Spray Cattle Posts—Rotenone sprays are effective on both lice and grubs of cattle, reminds Mr. Stanley Gesell, Penn State extension entomologist. Londane spray works well against lice and mange, but is not effective against grubs. A chemical known as Methoxychlor controls lice but not grubs or mange.

Observe 4-H Week — Pennsylvania 4-H Club members are in the midst of observing National 4-H Club Week. Allen L. Baker, State 4-H Club Leader of the Penna. State University, reports activities include re-organization of clubs, formation of new ones, selection of local leaders, and choice of projects.

Care for bees — Check on your bees right away, urges William Clarke, Penn State extension apiculturist. Remove the dead and weak colonies, clean the equipment, and feed all colonies that have a shortage of honey for their daily diet.

Treat Pea Seed — You can treat small amounts of pea seed for the home garden by shaking the seed in a can with the right amount of fungicide, until all seeds are well coated, says Allen Bauer, Penn State extension plant pathologist.

Study Grass — The Pennsylvania State University is offering a Grassland Farming Short Course March 14 to 19, announces David McClay, director of agricultural short courses.

The posters must be received at Zembo Mosque, Harrisburg, not later than April 1, 1955.

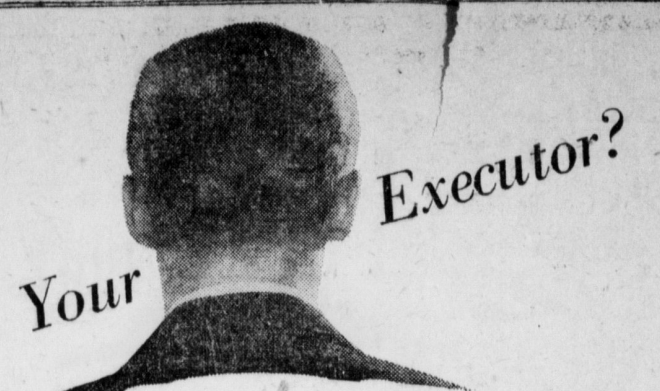
