### Robert Hurst Named President Of Rotary Club

Robert Hurst, president, Michael Pricio, vice president, Charles Ruhl, secretary, and Joseph Shaeffer, treasurer, will guide the activities of Mount Joy Rotary club when they are installed next June.

These officers were elected on Tuesday noon by the club's board of directors following the regular weekly luncheon meeting.

Hurst will succeed Adam Greer as president and Pricio succeeds Hurst as vice president. Ruhl and Shaeffer were re-elected to their offices.

Speaker of the day was Clarence C. Newcomer, Lancaster attorney, and son of Rotarian Clarence S. Newcomer of town. Mr. Newcomer discussed estate planning, showing the various methods by which proper drawing of wills and setting up of trusts will be of help to a man's family after his death.

The speaker offered a number of suggestions on how estates may be planned to reduce taxes and to retain estate administration in the hands of those in whom a man has confidence.

It was pointed out that when there is no will or trust the administration of an estate lies solely in the hands of the court, which can follow only the procedures prescribed by law. But the drawing of a will makes it possible for a man to place the administration of his estate with those who are best fitted to handle it to benefit his family the most.

### CPL. WILLIAM C. DOMMEL ARRIVES IN KOREA

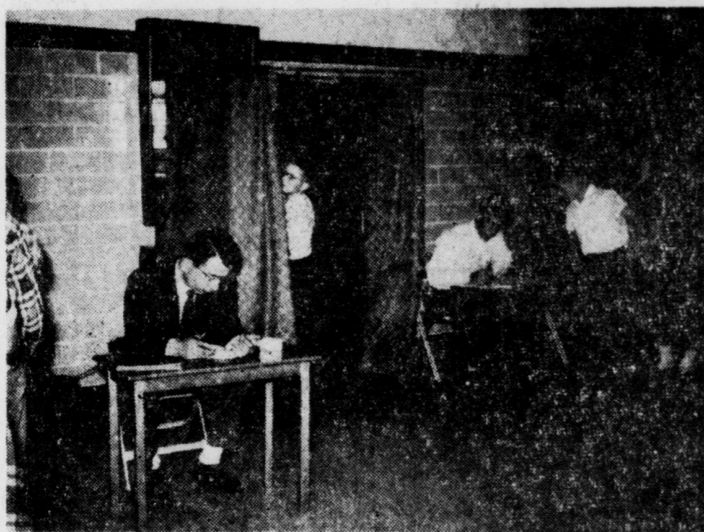

Congratulations on a fine season! The entire community is proud of you!



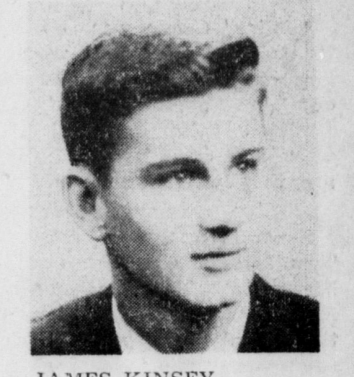

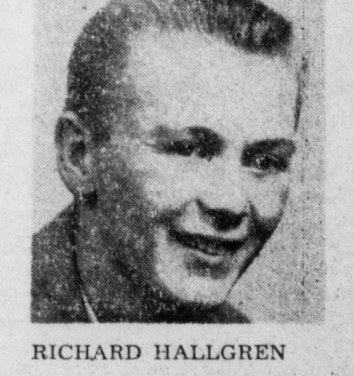
