Crispy-Top Corn Flake Souffle

2 tablespoons butter 2 tablespoons flour 11/2 cups grated American cheese

2½ cups corn flakes 4 eggs, separated 1 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon dry mustard Melt butter, add flour, and stir to a smooth paste. Add milk grad-ually; cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until thickened. Add cheese and stir until melted. Crush 2 cups of the corn flakes slightly; add to cheese sauce. Beat egg yolks with salt and mustard. Stir hot mixture gradually over the yolks. Beat egg whites until stiff and fold in cheese mixture. Turn into 2-quart casserole. Sprinkle remain-ing ½ cup corn flakes around edge or in center of casserole. Bake in a slow oven (325°F.) about 50 minutes. Yield: 6 servings.
