Board Discusses Elementary School Jointure

Members of the Donegal School Board again discussed the possibility of expanding the present jointure to include grades one through six at the regular March meeting last Thursday. This would involve the elementary grades in the two boroughs, Mount Joy and Marietta; and the two townships, East Donegal and Mount Joy.

Problems of the discussed expansion will be the responsibility of financing capital outlay for elementary schools and children going to the nearest school rather than to townships or borough residence.

If the proposal is adopted, the board will receive an additional \$5.00 annually from state aid and if the four districts would form a union, the annual gain would be \$35,000. Joseph Greiner was named chairman of a committee to draw up an agreement to be presented at the April meeting.

Jay Musser, acting chairman of the extra-curricular committee, reported that his committee recommends a four-year football program to replace the present five year schedule. After this year's introduction to the sport in the junior high; next year will include six junior varsity scrimmages; the following year, six junior varsity games and three varsity tilts and the fourth year, the committee feels that the school will be ready for Conference of Roses competition.

A. D. Seiler, chairman of the finance committee, announced that tentatively \$80,000 to \$90,000 will be required to complete the present year. Annual operation of the jointure costs of total of over \$370,000. E. Musser Heisey, president, was in charge of the meeting.

In order to form a school union rather than the present jointure, citizens of the four districts would have to vote in favor of the project in a general election at the polls.
