EASTER DRAMA TO BE PRESENTED

To Sponsor Public Lecture Sunday

A spokesman for Jehovah's witnesses announced plans today for delivering a special message to the world. Harold E. McCorkel, local presiding minister of the Columbia congregation, revealed some of the details of this special campaign, which includes sponsoring the public lecture entitled "Christianity or Christianity — Which One is the Light of the World?"

All congregations of Jehovah's witnesses throughout the world (there are approximately 14,000 in 159 lands) will participate. Mr. McCorkel will deliver this discourse locally, to which the public is invited. It will be delivered at the Kingdom Hall, Perry and Union Sts., Columbia, Sunday, April 3, at 3 p. m.

After the discourse a new 32 page booklet containing extraordinary information will be given free to each person in attendance. Some 600,000 of Jehovah's witnesses will then begin distribution of millions of copies of this special message in many languages throughout the world. It is the desire of Jehovah's witnesses to place a copy in every home. Mr. McCorkel said the contents of this specially prepared booklet had not yet been made public, but its message was unique and would be of special interest to persons of all faiths.

"Advance preparation and the world-wide scope of this special campaign give indication that this may well be one of the greatest religious proclamations in modern history," Mr. McCorkel said. He went on to tell of local plans that have been made, stating that Jehovah's witnesses here are ready and eagerly looking forward to this special campaign.

Benefit Livestock Sale Nets \$2800 For Church Fund

A registered Holstein heifer donated to the church building fund auction Saturday, March 26, on the Ray Brandt farm for the Conewago Church of the Brethren between Deodate and Bachmansville.

The heifer was donated by the Rev. Daniel Kettering, one of the ministers of the congregation who is a breeder of Holstein cattle. The heifer weighed 1225 lbs. due to calf in May and was purchased by C. S. Erb, Holstein cattle dealer of Middletown. The contending bidder was Walter Lehman, cattle dealer of Lawn.

A baby beef was donated for the sale by the Rev. Robert Young, also a minister of the Conewago church. The baby beef sold for \$182.50.

A 1320 lb. steer was donated by another member of the church and sold for \$270.60. Two fat hogs were donated by Donald Shope of Highspire selling for \$45 each. Several sheep and small pigs and heifers were also donated by neighbors and members.

Several items of used farm equipment and various articles of household goods were donated. One ton of hay sold for \$35. Two tons of corn, one for \$42.50 and one for \$40.00 per ton.

The total of the sale of articles and livestock donated was \$2,540.35. The ladies of the church sold \$243.12 at their refreshment stand. The intermediate Sunday School class sold \$37.06 from their display of home made hot pads, handkerchiefs, flowers, etc.

Roy Reiber was in charge of the consignments for the benefit auction. Paul E. Sanger, Lebanon county commissioner, was the auctioneer, assisted by Richard Buffenmeyer and Harvey Ebersole. Sale clerks were Paul Kaylor and Robert Young. Everybody donated their time and service free of charge including the auctioneers.

Elder Norman Patrick is elder in charge of the congregation. Other ministers besides Kettering and Young are the Rev. Harry Aldinger and the Rev. Earl Eshleman.

The sale brought a grand total to start a new church building fund of \$2,810.53. The Conewago congregation has two small church buildings, but both are too small to hold the growing church membership.

Easter Seal Drive At Halfway Mark

Volunteers, meeting at the office of the Lancaster County Society for Crippled Children and Adults, have been busy opening returns of the 1955 Easter Seal appeal. Forty volunteers have been recruited for this important task according to Mrs. Wm. G. Johnstone, Jr., Chairman.

The campaign opened March 1.0. Approximately 53,000 letters were sent out to citizens of Lancaster county enclosing Easter Seals, the returns of which mean treatment and service to the physically handicapped.

Returns to date show that \$11,740.75 has been received from interested citizens who have the handicapped youngsters and adults at heart and have returned their Easter Seal envelopes with contributions. The goal of the Lancaster County Society for Crippled Children & Adults has been set at \$22,500.

"Returns are continuing to come in," said Mrs. Johnstone, and volunteers will continue to be on hand for several more weeks to open mail and record returns.

The campaign closes officially on Easter Sunday, April 10th. Citizens who did not receive Easter Seals in the mail may make their contributions thru the mail by addressing their envelopes to Crippled Children, c/o Your Local Post Office.

Navy Recruiting Station Gives Hours

It was announced today by Chief L. Stevens of the Lancaster Navy recruiting station that effective immediately the office hours of the local station will be from 8:30 a. m. to 4:30 p. m. Monday through Friday and from 8:30 a. m. to 12:00 noon on Saturdays. As in the past, the office will be closed on Sundays and Holidays.

Chief Stevens reminds all that the Navy's drive for enlistments is still going strong, and that because the listed closing times are for general guidance does not mean that they are ironclad, as the office will stay open later and open earlier to accommodate interested parties.

For the benefit of high school graduates, the local station has 10 vacancies for trade schools, which include three in electronics and one in aviation. Remember, enlistment for and guarantee of a trade school is reserved for high school graduates. Others get theirs after enlistment and classification.


