Donegal High School's Jay Metzler has been honored by the United Press today by being named on the first team of the Little All-State basketball team.



The members of the "Little All-State" basketball teams are chosen by Sportswriters and Broadcasters from all over Pennsylvania, and are chosen from schools with an enrollment of less than 500 students, or Class "B".

In the United Press release, U. P. Sports Writer Burt Siglin stated, "Metzler is a standout rebounder and an equally fine scorer. He was sudden death under the backboards all year, as the Donegal team went undefeated before being dropped in the Eastern finals of the Class "B" eliminations, by Fountain Hill."

Other players in the area to be honored were Wrightsville's Barré Ritz, who was named to the second team, and Ted Carey, Columbia High School's all-around athlete, received honorable mention.
