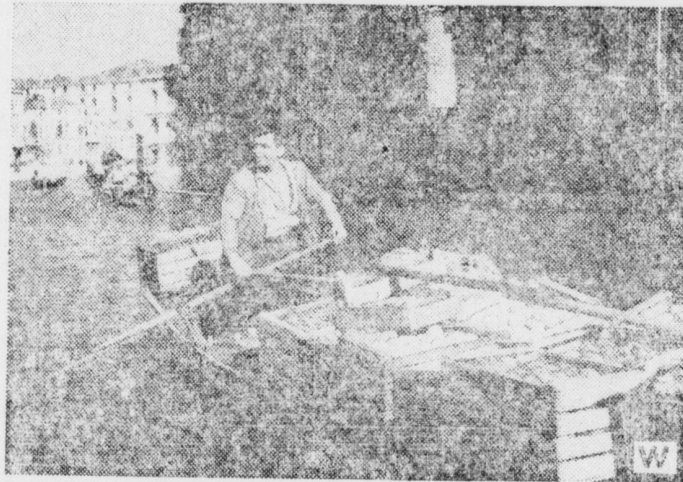
School Scenes Are Next

Persons Going To Church

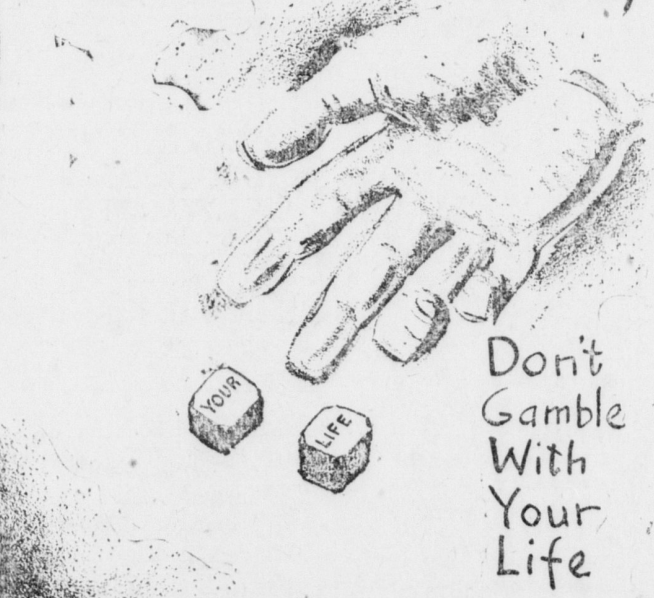
