

### Christian Youth Assembly To Meet April 29 At Sharon

Harrisburg — Christian youth will work out the answers to 2 big questions: Who in America is responsible for juvenile crime and delinquency? What can youth do to change the trend?

More than 200 delegates to the annual assembly of the United Christian Youth Movement meeting in Sharon, Penna., April 29 through May 1 will tackle these knotty questions.

Clair Wagner, of Mount Joy, is chairman of the Commission on Christian Faith of the statewide youth organization.

He will participate with the more than 200 youth delegates in tackling the problem of delinquency.

The young people will represent the youth work of nineteen denominations and 220 Christian youth councils in Pennsylvania.

They will dig into the problem of juvenile delinquency and come up with answers adequate for the needs of youth in their own communities said Rev. Shauncey J. Varner, director of youth work for the Pennsylvania Council of Christian Education.

Mr. Varner said that the United States Childrens Bureau receives 100 letters a week offering remedies for delinquency. Most of them suggest some kind of punishment. Will youth accept this approach?

Miss Sandra Johnson, Harrisburg, chairman of the Youth Cabinet planning the meeting, said that the youth will give a major part of the conference to discussion of this issue.

The theme for the three day meeting will be "Our Citizenship Under Christ."

The United Christian Youth Movement is the youth work department of the Pennsylvania Council of Christian Education working cooperatively with the Pennsylvania Council of Churches.

Miss Lydia Garrido, an outstanding youth leader from the Philippine Islands, chairman of the youth department of the World Council of Christian Education will address the Assembly Saturday evening. She served as youth consultant to the Second Assembly of the World Council of Churches at Evanston in August, 1954.

As an ambassador from the Philippines to Pennsylvania's Christian youth, she traveled through the state from Sept. 14, 1954 to January 14, 1955, speaking to many youth groups.

Miss Sandra Johnston will preside at the opening session on Friday evening. The Mercer County Christian Youth Council will conduct the devotional service. Rev. Wilson A. Cheek, National Director of the United Christian Youth Movement, will be the keynote speaker on Friday evening at 7:00 p.m. He will address the conference on the theme "Our Citizenship Under Christ." The Friday session will close at 9:00 p. m. with a fellowship hour.

The Saturday morning session will begin at 9:00 a.m. with devotions led by the Dauphin Co. Christian Youth Council. At 10 o'clock the five commissions will meet for program study and planning.

John Piper, Pittsburgh, chairman of the commission on worship, will preside at the service on Saturday evening. The Mercer County youth choir will sing and Miss Garrido will address the gathering.

The conference will close on Sunday afternoon with the installations of officers and the service of Holy Communion. The meditation for the communion
