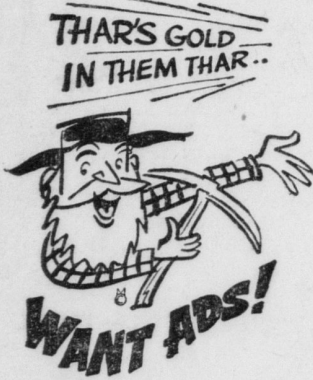

**MOUNT JOY BOROUGH SCHOOL PER CAPITA TAX** The School District of the Borough of Mount Joy gives notice that its School Board intends to adopt a resolution on May 5, 1955, (at 7:00 p. m., standard time, at Mount Joy Grade School Building,) levying a per capita tax of \$5 for the school year 1955-56 on each adult resident of said School District, under the provisions of the Act of 1947, P. L. 1145, as amended, in addition to the \$5 per capita tax authorized under the School Code of 1949. ## SPRING MUSICAL CONCERT

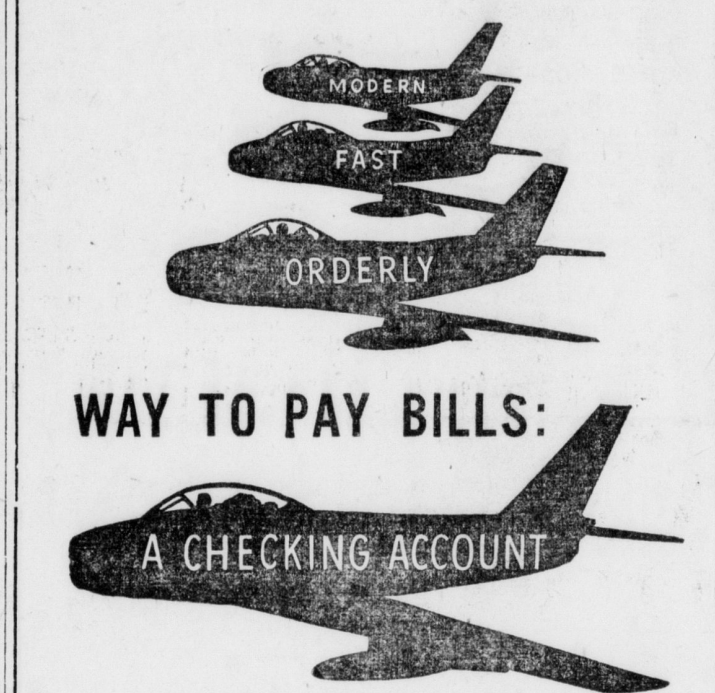
The Women's Association of the First Presbyterian Church will present a Spring Musical Concert during the last week of April. The exact date will be announced later.
