Bishop Hostetter To Speak Sunday At Cross Roads Church

Bishop C. N. Hostetter, Jr., President of Messiah College and Chairman of the Mennonite Central Committee, will speak at Cross Roads Brethren in Christ Church, 10:30 Sunday morning, May 1 on the subject, "The I-W in Today's World".



Bishop Hostetter has traveled as a representative for the Mennonite Central Committee in the interest of relief in the United States and abroad.

This Committee is one of several world organizations, Friends Service, Brethren and Lutheran Action, which are serving in this field.

This meeting will convene at the time of the regular morning worship. It is geared to the angle of service. An offering will be received toward the completion of the Congregation's Relief and Service Budget.

Two young people of this congregation have been serving in this type of work, Miss Ethel Wolgemuth, a registered nurse, in Jordan and Mr. James Hostetter in Germany.

In the same meeting, Howard Landis, Souderton, Pa. will share impressions of his recent experiences as a Pax boy during his three years of service in Germany and Greece. He participated in an agricultural experimental improvement program supported jointly by the U. S. Government and the Mennonite Central Committee.

Lutheran Auxiliary Votes \$800 To Home For Older People

At a meeting this week of the executive committee of the auxiliary to Lutheran Inner Missions of the Lancaster Conference, Central Pennsylvania Synod, Mrs. Fred Hausch presiding, a check for \$800 was voted to be sent to The Lutheran Home for Older People.

The chairman of the membership committee, Mrs. Thomas Krick announced that up to the present time there are 1160 members in the auxiliary. A special committee was adopted to give aid to The Home and the president appointed Mrs. Raymond Epelner, chairman. Also Mrs. Robert Zink was appointed chairman of the nominating committee. The next meeting will be held the third Monday in September.

Children's Rally To Be Held Sunday At McCaskey High

"Roundup Time on the Bar-None Ranch" will be the theme for a children's rally to be held Sunday afternoon, May 1, at 2:30, in the McCaskey High School Auditorium.

This rally, sponsored by the Child Evangelism Fellowship of Lancaster county, is an annual event, and a climax to the winter's activities of the organization.

About 8000 city and county children have been enrolled in the weekly Good News Clubs conducted by the Fellowship during the past 7 months. Most of these Clubs are directed by volunteer workers who receive instruction in weekly teacher training classes. A Good News Club meeting consists of singing, stories, (Bible, missionary, and character building), scripture memorization and special missionary projects, and is geared to reach the elementary school age child.

The organization is of an inter-denominational nature and seeks through these week-day classes to direct unchurched children into the local church and Sunday School.

The Roundup Time program will feature the Bible Story film, "The Fiery Furnace." Special music will be provided by Claire Greiner, accordionist, and the Shaebly Family. A number of children from various clubs will participate. Bard Eichelberger will be in charge of group singing and Sylvia Shetter will be the pianist. The rally is open to the public, and the parents of the children are invited to attend.

The Child Evangelism Fellowship of Lancaster county is under the direction of Miss Katherine E. Hershey and Geo. G. Buhler.
