Donegal High School was admitted to the football Conference of the Roses at the annual clinic of the South-Central Football Coaches Association.

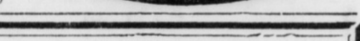
Tom Donan, coach of Columbia High School's football team, was named president of the association at the first meeting held at the Millersville State Teachers College Saturday.

Donegal Takes Over First Place In Baseball League Standings

Alan Kugle's Frank Merriwell finish enabled Donegal's Indians to down Columbia High School 1 to 0 Wednesday at Columbia.

Donegal gained undisputed possession of first place in the County baseball league with their second straight shut-out having downed Lititz Friday afternoon 4-0 at Lititz.

Don Raber of Donegal and Art Ford of Columbia hooked up in an air tight pitching duel and the outcome was not decided until the top half of the 8th inning when Donegal scored the only run of the game.

Raber was knicked for hits in the 4th and 5th innings by Columbia, and Donegal was unable to solve the slants of Ford, he retained 13 of the first 14 men to face him.

Columbia's biggest threat came in the 5th inning when they filled the bases with a hit sandwiched between two base on balls, but Raber rose to the occasion, and retired the side with a fly ball to left field.

In the top of the 8th inning Ford took care of Weber, and Hostetter for the first two outs to keep his no-hitter intact. Crookes, Donegal's catcher worked Ford for a walk, this proved to be Ford's downfall. Raber followed with a clean line drive up the middle for their first hit, moving Crookes to second and he scored on a single to right by "Old Reliable" Alan Kugle. Hallgren struck out to retire the side.

Columbia tried hard to pull the game out of the fire in the last half of the last inning, Shive singled through the box, Bell sacrificed him to second. Here Donegal's coaches Staley and Gemberling played the percentages, with Raber showing signs of tiring, and darkness approaching decided to send Grove in to pitch, who has a good fast ball and good control. Columbia's shortstop fled out to center. Carey the big tide's first baseman and most dangerous hitter worked the count to 3-1 before Grove struck him out to end the game.

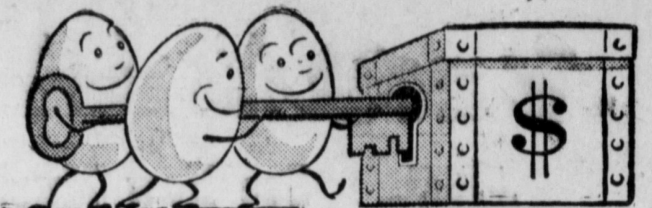

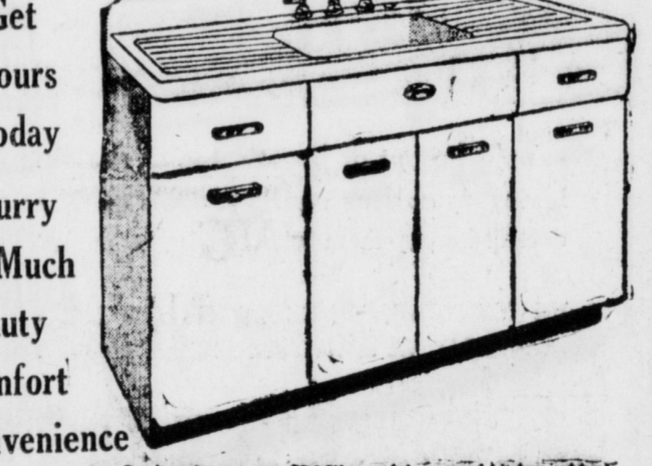
