"Great athletes don't just happen . . . There is no substitute for work," declared Davies.

"Our very existence depends upon faith . . . and the basis of all faith is the Bible," the speaker stated.

The importance of conditioning was stressed. Davies pointed out that no athlete is at his best unless he keeps in the best of physical condition, induced by clean living, lots of exercise and practice.

The promotion of others, not one's self, was given as another of the chief factors of success, and the speaker concluded his remarks with an admonition to play the game according to the rules.

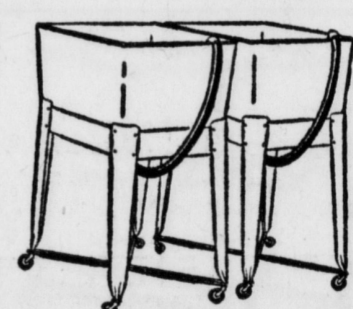
