operating on the same millage while all costs of living have been rising.

It was also brought out that on the busiest days, the free parking lots at the railroad are not used until all the metered spaces are filled.

The Council also decided against removing two meters on West Main Street near the entrances to a service station.

One Hour Meters Next

Following the motions made to extend the metered parking spaces, a unanimous vote was passed ordering all the meters between Barbara and Market Streets to become one hour parking meters instead of the two hour limits.

A spot of parking space on North Market Street will be reserved for the police car and will have lines painted to that effect.

No parking signs will be erected on either side of the alley entrance between Manheim and Fairview Streets.

To Investigate Parking Lo's

The special committee appointed by President Myers to check on the possibility of creating more free parking area along the railroad tracks reported their find. According to the report the space along the railroad cut between High and New Haven Streets could be developed. If permission could be secured, revenue would be needed to place guard railings and macadam in the area or parts of the area for public use. Until funds can be secured, the matter was tabled.

The street committee was instructed to check the possibility of lining the present parking lot to create two rows of parking spaces instead of the one now being used. This would double the amount of automobiles that could park on the two existing lots.

Street Lights Passed

Three new street lights will be installed in the borough; one on the new development of South Delta Street, one on Park Avenue and one where Park, Barbara and Manheim Streets meet beyond the borough park.

Chief Of Police Reports

Included in the chief of police's report, Park Neiss showed examples of "Live" ammunition found in the Little Chiques Creek near the bridge on the Manheim Road. The ammunition included parts of hand grenades and clips of shells.

He also reported 36 parking tickets issued, 1 arrest made for ignoring traffic signal, one for ignoring a stop sign, one reckless driving, 1 drunken driving and 1 case of larceny.

Ray Myers, fire chief, reported no fire calls for the month of April.

Citizens Volunteer Services

Two residents volunteered their services as bricklayers to build a new fire place and rebuild a fireplace at the borough's picnic area at "The Cove". Ruined by Hurricane Hazel, the structures will be rebuilt by Jacob Zeller and William Waltz, who volunteered to contribute their time to the project.
