A Good Posture Benefit Ball on May 7 will highlight "Good Posture Week." It was announced during a meeting of the Lancaster County Chiropractic Society.

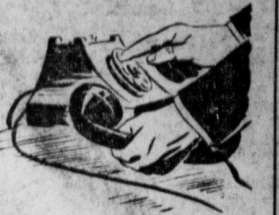
