Farm Calendar

Timely Reminders from The Pennsylvania State University College of Agriculture

Birds Need Comfort — An experienced poultryman doesn't need a body thermometer to know whether the body temperature of his birds is just right for growth and production. He can tell in a minute by the behavior of the birds whether they are comfortably warm or cool.

Spray Roses — A good spray program will control brown canker and black spot of roses. Spray every week, as soon as growth starts, with captan at the rate of 1½ tablespoons per gallon of water.

Choose Good Sire — Selection of the beef herd sire is a far-reaching decision. "A good bull is half the herd, but a poor bull is all the herd. The bull's influence, good or bad, will remain in the herd for several generations.

More Spring Planting — Total acreage planted to spring crops is expected to be slightly larger this year than in 1954. The acreage in feed grains will be the largest in recent years.

Fewer Turkeys Expected — Pennsylvania growers intend to cut production of turkeys this year. For the nation, heavy turkeys will be about the same, with fewer lightweight birds.

Profit in Trees — Better management of farm woodlands will help the owners get the highest returns at least cost.

POURING GAS ON FIRE — "Dropping taxes by increasing federal debt is like pouring gasoline on a fire—it is inflation, giving a man new money which won't buy as much as his old money. 
