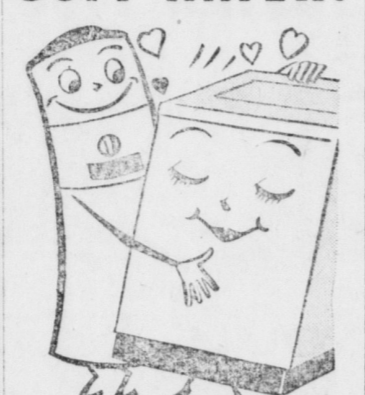

**FIRST GAS TURBINE CAR IN TRAFFIC**



Motorists in Detroit and its suburbs are seeing Chrysler Corporation's "Turbine Special" for the first time on city streets, but they have to look closely to detect any exterior distinctions from current Plymouth cars with conventional engines. The Chrysler experimental gas turbine engine is the first to successfully power a production type passenger car and the first to solve the long-standing gas turbine problems of high fuel consumption and tremendous exhaust heat. The gas turbine engine is being test-driven on city streets and at the Chrysler Engineering Proving Grounds in a 1955 Plymouth Belvedere sedan. There remain many metallurgical and manufacturing problems to be solved if gas turbine engines are to become the automotive power plants of the future.
