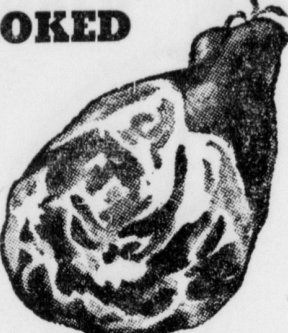

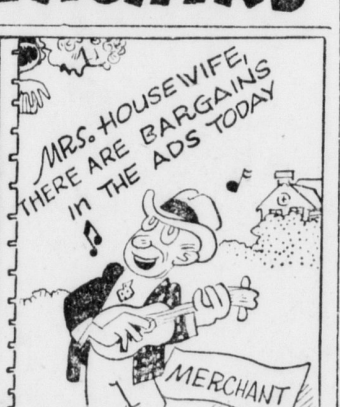

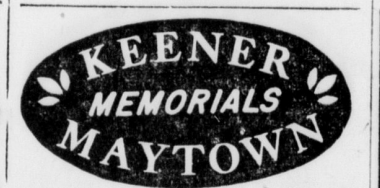

BOOT CAMP AVAILABLE TO MARINE RESERVISTS

Captain N. N. Rubin, inspector-instructor of the Marine reserve unit, Columbia, announced that headquarters Marine Corps has initiated a program whereby reservists may attend regular Marine Corps "Boot Camp" at Parris Island, S. C. for a period of 10 weeks during the summer.

The Marine corps is the first branch of the armed forces to initiate this new program. Members of the reserve unit must apply thirty days prior to the day they wish to be assigned to active duty. When assigned, they receive full pay and allowances. Members of East coast units will be assigned to Parris Island, S. C. and members of West coast units will be assigned to San Diego, Calif.

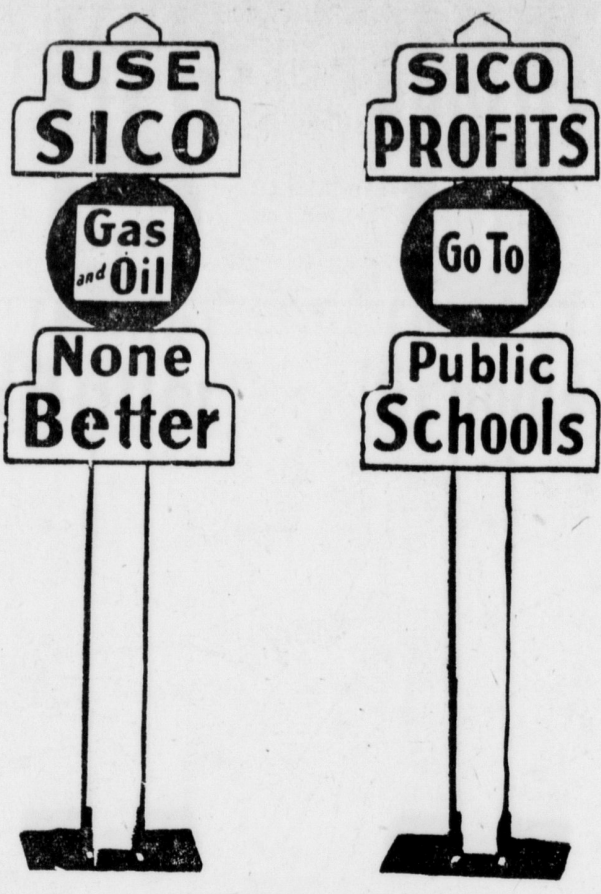
