### LANCASTER HOSPITAL BIG GIFT DRIVE GOES OVER TOP

The City Business Big Gifts Division of the Lancaster General Hospital's 1955 Charity and Replacement Campaign has gone over the top of their division goal, it was announced today by G. Theodore Storb and I. C. Weidman, this year's campaign general co-chairmen.

The City Business Big Gifts goal was \$33,000 and \$33,287 has been subscribed. This is the first of the campaigns six divisions, which have a combined goal of \$108,000, to meet their quota.

The other divisions standings are: City Individual Big Gifts Division \$29,476 or 92 percent of its goal of \$32,000, while the City General division's goal of \$7,000 and \$6,594 or 94 percent has been contributed. County Big Gifts Division \$13,429 for 67 percent of their goal of \$20,000. County General Division \$9,140 which is 65 percent toward its goal of \$14,000 and the City Out of Town Firms \$1,210 60 percent of a goal of \$2,000. This represents a total of \$93,136 or 86 percent toward the total goal. The drive chairmen urge that workers and chairmen alike complete their work as soon as possible for a successful conclusion of this campaign effort.
