8 DO YOU KNOW . . . What per cent of all the water used in the home is or should be hot? Over 70%. There are more than 150 uses for hot water in the home.

What is the most desirable temperature setting of a water heater? Why? 150°. The hotter the water the further a given amount spreads in normal house-hold use. In effect, a 50gallon tank of 150° water gives the consumer the same hot water storage as a 60-gallon tank of 130° water. A 66 gallon electric water heater. An electric water heater should be sized in relation to the size of the house. People don't trade in water heaters like they do automobiles. Consequently, it's important to size an electric water heater in accordance with the imber of bedrooms bathrooms thus allowing and overnight guests.

The following chart may be used as a guide to assist in selecting the proper sized heater:
