 Q. What per cent of all the water used in the home is or should be hot?  
 A. Over 70%. There are more than 150 uses for hot water in the home.  
 Q. What is the most desirable temperature - setting of a water heater? Why?  
 A. 150°. The hotter the water, the further a given amount spreads in normal household use. In effect, a 50-gallon tank of 150° water gives the consumer the same hot water storage as a 60-gallon tank of 130° water. And, heating water to temperatures exceeding 150° is dangerous because it will scald the user. Also temperatures exceeding 150 degrees rapidly increase the rate of corrosive action.  
 Q. Why is it important to have an automatic water heater with an automatic washer or electric dishwasher?  
 A. To furnish an ample supply of 150° hot water for most effective cleansing action.

 Q. Can water be heated continuously or only during certain hours under PP&L's electric water heating rate?  
 A. Continuously. 24 hours a day, if necessary.  
 Q. How many gallons of water may be heated with one Kilowatt hour?  
 A. Approximately 4 gallons.  
 Q. What sizes of electric water heaters are generally used in homes?  
 A. 50, 66 and 80 gallon sizes. Large homes require water heaters in excess of 80 gallon capacity. More than one electric water heater is recommended for homes in which the kitchen and bathroom are widely separated and piping runs would otherwise be excessively long.  
 Q. What is the minimum size electric water heater recommended for a family of two, living in a home with three bedrooms and two bathrooms?  
 A. A 66 gallon electric water heater. An electric water heater should be sized in relation to the size of the house. People don't trade in water heaters like they do automobiles. Consequently, it's important to size an electric water heater in accordance with the number of bedrooms and bathrooms thus allowing for increases in families and overnight guests.  
 The following chart may be used as a guide to assist in selecting the proper sized heater:

Number Bedrooms	Number Bathrooms	Heater Gallons
1 or 2	1	50
3 or 4	1	60 to 70
2 or 3	2	60 to 70
4 or 5	2	80 to 90
3	3	80 to 90
4 or 5	3 or 4	118 or larger
