Is Your Cooling Fooling?



It takes more than an air conditioner and an electric outlet to make a room cool, as this character is finding out the hard way. Proper cooling depends on the capacity of the unit in relation to the size and location of the room; the type of building construction and insulation; the amount of glass; correct installation of the unit; and the size of the wires and fuses or circuit breakers supplying electricity.

If your house wiring is already overtaxed, no air conditioner, no matter how new or how large, will perform as it should. Industry spokesmen like Kennecott Copper Corporation recommend that each unit be connected to an electric circuit for its exclusive use. While smaller one-third and one-half ton units will work on ordinary 120 volt house current, three-quarter ton units and larger need a 240 volt line for best operation. Probably no more than 20 percent of all houses in this country can meet these requirements.

Inadequate wiring causes air conditioners to slow down, overheat, blow fuses or trip circuit breakers, burn out motors, or even to stop operating altogether.

Before you buy an air conditioner, better call in an electrical contractor and have him survey your house wiring. A small investment in a new circuit and a special outlet may save you a lot of headaches later, not to mention heat aches.
