Lancaster County Milk Income Over \$20 Million

HARRISBURG—Lancaster County's income from milk topped \$20,810,947 during 1954 according to Pennsylvania's June Dairy Month Committee which released the following:

The county's 55,000 cows produced a record 36,900,000 lbs. of milk valued at \$15,887,400. Another estimated \$4,923,547 was paid to Lancaster County dairy plant employees.

"This huge sum once again points out the tremendous economic value of the dairy industry to Pennsylvania," said J. Collins McSparran, chairman of the State June Dairy Month Committee.

"Because our state is so industrialized, with steel and other industries gaining much more prominence, few Pennsylvanians realize the Commonwealth ranks third as a milk consuming state and fifth as a milk producing state in the nation even though it is only 33rd in area size."

McSparran, a Lancaster Co. Dairy Farmer and secretary of the Pennsylvania State Grange, said one of every 25 people living in the Commonwealth depends on milk or milk products for their livelihood. He stated the annual income from milk exceeds the \$400,000,000 mark in payments to producers and dairy employees.

"Pennsylvania dairy farmers alone received \$285,023,000 for their 6,156,000,000 pounds of milk in 1954," McSparran continued, "which represents a great achievement for the 43,000 dairy farm families who work long hours, seven days a week, doing their share in assisting the milk distributors to place on our doorsteps at high quality milk as can be found anywhere in the nation."

"Actually," McSparran added, "the dollars spent by Pennsylvania's milk consuming public have multiple value. Besides keeping Pennsylvania cash registers ringing, milk and milk products do more to keep Pennsylvania healthy than any other comparable food product while adding extra taste enjoyment to any meal."


