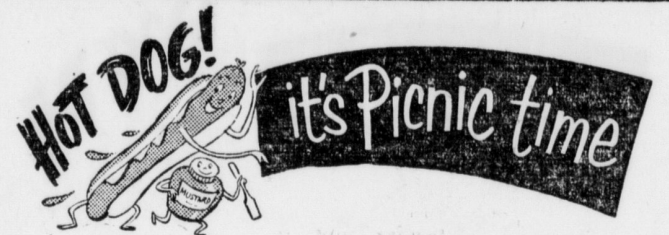

Farm Calendar

Eggs for Local Market — If you are producing eggs for a local market, you can arrange the production schedule to fit the needs, says Harry Kauffman, Penn State extension poultry specialist. One flock hatched in winter and another flock hatched in June can help equalize the monthly production.

Cut Seed Stalks — Rhubarb seed stalks waste food reserves, weaken the plants and reduce the number and quality of edible stalks the plants produce, according to James Dutt, Penn State extension vegetable specialist. He says that they should be cut off as soon as they appear.

Regular Sprays Needed — Do not let late blight get started in your potato field, cautions Allen Bauer, Penn State extension plant pathologist. Nabam and zinc spray materials will give 5- to 7-day protection, and fixed copper will protect the plants at least a week. Bordeaux mixture lasts slightly longer.

Hay Cures Faster — Use of a hay crusher speeds up field curing, reports Burton Horne, Penn State extension agricultural engineer. The crusher cracks the stems lengthwise and brings air into contact with the moist, inner parts.

Know Weed Killers — Many new chemicals are being used for weed control. George Berggren, Penn State agronomist, reminds that successful weed control depends upon use of the right chemical at the right time on the weed to be killed.

Side-dress Sweet Corn — For more and better sweet corn, side-dress fertilizer along the rows, recommends James Dutt, Penn State extension vegetable specialist.

Five Cows Are Tested By Association

Announcements have been received from the Holstein-Friesian Association of America of the completion of an official production record by registered Holstein cows owned by five local men.

Albert R. Fry, Manheim, is the owner of Raythur Bonnie Flora who produced 660 pounds of butterfat, 17,061 pounds of milk when she was milked two times daily in 365 days. Her average quarts daily totaled 22. Her age when the record began was 8 years, 8 months.

Clovena Daisy Iria, owned by Henry Hess, Mount Joy, produced 628 pounds of butterfat and 16,877 pounds of milk while being milked two times daily in 349 days. Her average daily yield was 23. She was 9 years and 2 months old when the record was started.

Polly Gelsche Dora, owned by Harvey Rettew, Manheim RD, produced 582 pounds of butterfat and 17,664 pounds of milk while being milked two times daily in 335 days. Her average quarts daily totaled 25. She was 6 years and 5 months when the record was started.

M. M. Wenger, Rheems, is owner of Cylon Homestead Burke, which produced 505 pounds of butterfat and 13,418 pounds of milk while being milked two times daily in 294 days. Her average yield was 21 quarts daily. Her age when the record began was 8 years and 3 months.

A. W. Wickenheiser, Mount Joy, is owner of Lucy Lauxmont Toitilla, which produced 554 pounds of butterfat and 14,505 pounds of milk while being milked two times daily in 329 days. Her average quarts daily totaled 20. She was 3 years and 5 months old when the record began.

Pennsylvania State University supervised the weighing and testing of the milk for this record and it is a part of the Herd Improvement Registry Department of the Holstein-Friesian Association of America in Brattleboro, Vermont. This program is designed to give an official production record on every cow in the herd every year so that wise selection for increased efficiency can be made.

Timely Reminders from The Pennsylvania State University College of Agriculture

Skim Milk Provides — Skim milk has the same food value as whole milk except fewer calories and no vitamin A.

Need Milk — Fragile bones as common among older persons may be due to prolonged deficiencies in calcium. This can be remedied if adults drink three cups of milk a day.

Milk Cost — Today you can buy a quart of milk at lower cost than ever before in terms of the amount of time you must work to earn enough to buy the milk.

Milk Offers — Milk offers some 100 nutrients—a long list of vitamins and minerals, high-quality protein, fats, and sugar.

To Get Calcium — It's hard to get enough calcium for strong bones and teeth without drinking milk or using it in cooking or serving cheese and ice cream.

Butter Hoarded — Butter was probably the first dairy product made from milk. When it was found to be a good food, it was hoarded as a sign of wealth.

Ice Cream Debut — Ice cream first came into being in New York during the Revolutionary War. In Washington, Dolly Madison introduced the foodstuff at a White House dinner and started it on its rise to nation-wide popularity.

P. P. & L. REPORTS YEAR'S EARNINGS

Consolidated earnings of the Pennsylvania Power & Light Company and its subsidiary, the Scranton Electric Company, accruing to the common stock of Pennsylvania Power & Light Company for the twelve months ended May 31, 1955, were \$16,797,333, equivalent to \$2.95 per share of common stock outstanding at such date, as compared with \$15,710,798 or \$2.79 pr share on a pro forma consolidated basis for the twelve months ended May 31, 1954. Consolidated revenues for the twelve months ended May 31, 1955, were \$110,958,745, an increase of 2.6% over the revenues for the previous year.

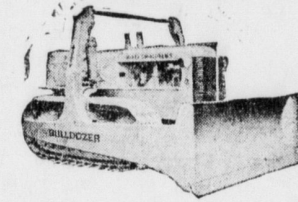

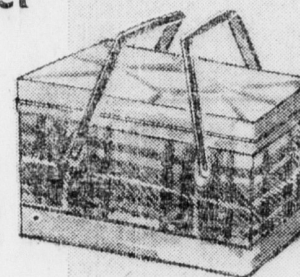

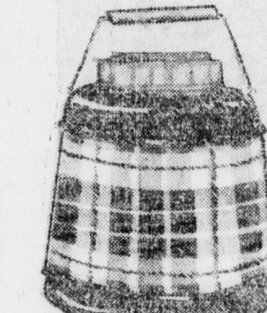
