GRAIN SANITARY REGULATIONS TIGHTENED BY CCC

One year's imprisonment, a \$1,000 fine, or both now face farmers and growers who offer grain for sale or deliver CCC stored grain that does not meet the sanitary requirements which are now being enforced by the Food and Drug Administration, warns Harold Swartley, Secretary of the Pennsylvania Crop Improvement Association.

All grain must be graded according to the new sanitation standards and in accordance with the loan agreement. In previous years some grain was delivered to CCC which was unfit for human consumption because of insect or rodent damage. Under the new regulations, two rodent pellets per pint or two percent weevil damage prevents wheat from being sold for human consumption.

When grain is sold off the farm to an elevator or warehouse, the final utilization of the grain is unknown. It may be used for either human food or cattle feed. Since a large percentage of this grain enters human consumption channels, elevator operators will not accept for storage or shipment grain which may be seized by the Food and Drug Administration.

Under the present law, grain may be considered adulterated by the grower when it contains any filthy, putrid, or decomposed materials which make it unfit for human consumption. Violators of this law shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and may be fined and imprisoned.

Grains are foods. Harvest and store them under the same sanitary standards as you would other foods for human consumption.

CORRECT COMBINE ADJUSTMENT NEEDED FOR TOP YIELDS

Correct combine adjustment is one of the most important operations of a small grain grower, yet on many farms insufficient attention is given to this important preparatory step, according to Harold Swartley, Pennsylvania Crop Improvement Secretary.

Modern combines are precision built to provide maximum efficiency when properly adjusted, and all combine owners and operators should refer to their copy of adjustment directions furnished with their combine before attempting to correct their speeds, clearances, and general overall adjustment. Most of this work can be completed before entering the field, but final regulation must be performed after running some of the grain through the combine.

Q.—How can I get rid of green moss in my lawn?

Ans.—First of all you must improve the condition of your soil. Aerify and loosen the soil. It is seldom necessary to dig up the surface, but it is important to reduce soil compaction and thus make it easier for the grass roots to go deeper into the soil. Also fertilize your soil with a 5-10-5 fertilizer to encourage grass to grow. In your case it may also be necessary to plant seed.

FARM TO LIVE—LIVE TO FARM

Q.—When is the best time to cut rose bushes down?

Ans.—Rose bushes shouldn't be cut down if there is still a possibility of frost. This is quite important since frost will kill the newly cut tender shoots. Therefore, I would suggest waiting a few more weeks before pruning your roses.

MAKE '53 ACCIDENT FREE

Q.—What can I do to get rid of ants?

Ans.—The most effective way to get rid of house ants is to locate the nest and pour a tablespoon or two of carbon disulphide into the nest. You may obtain this solution at drugstores. A word of caution—carbon sulphide is explosive, so keep away from fire and heat. If you are unable to find the nest, dust with 10% DDT or spray 5% DDT solution in cracks and about areas from which ants are emerging. Spray well around baseboards. Also many of the commercial baits on the market today are very effective in eliminating ants.
