The meeting topic will be, "The Current Milk Price Situation". Speakers will be members of the staff of the Producers Bargaining Agency. The speakers will, with the aid of graphic screen projectors, show trends in production, milk sales and other factors which affect milk prices in the New York market. Opportunity will be provided for discussion and questions from the audience.
Chairman of the meeting will be Abner Risser, President of the Mount Joy Farmers Co-operative Association. The meeting is part of the Bargaining Agency's program of market-wide service for the purpose of helping all dairy farmers better understand the current milk market situation and to familiarize them with the operation of the New York Metropolitan Milk Marketing Order.


