water had not yet been hooked up to the Boy Scout building. It seems that in January the Scouts made the request that the work be done as soon as the frost was out of the ground. And the Authority granted the request. No one had any explanation as to why the connection has not yet been made.

**To Eliminate Dead Ends**  
The engineer also was instructed to proceed as rapidly as possible with laying of mains to eliminate dead ends in the water system on Mount Joy Street, Park Avenue, Old Market Street and Manheim Road, and in the Birchland Avenue area.

Secretary Gerberich pointed out the importance of speeding this work to assure ample water pressure in case of fire. He suggested the possibility of bringing a line down Orchard Road to a point that would coincide with Cedar Lane extended, down Cedar Lane and then south to hook up with the eight inch main on West Main Street in front of the Paper Box Company.

(5) Market Street, both sides from Henry Street to Apple Tree Alley.  
(6) South Delta Street, both sides, from East Main Street to Henry Street.  
(7) The south side of Marietta Avenue from East Main Street to the Pennsylvania Railroad Bridge.  
(8) The north side of Marietta Avenue from East Main Street to Henry Street.
