Borough Authority Acts To Retain **Fiscal Agents**

Notable progress in bringing sewers to Mount Joy was evident in Tuesday night's meeting of the Borough Authority.

Engineer Joseph A. Michaels placed nearly complete plans for both the disposal plant and the sewer lines before the authority That these plans will be completed and placed in the hands of the state in September

The Authority voted unanimously to retain C. C. Collings and Company, Inc., of Philadelphia as fiscal agents. By this action the Authority members made certain that plans for financing the project will be ready as soon as the state has approved engineering plans.

Clifford C. Collings, Jr., pointed out the necessity for starting work immediately on preliminary financ'al plans. Then, he pointed out it will only require a few days after state approval of the project has been received to iron out final details.

Mr Collins presented an imposing list of municipal projects for which his company has acted as fiscal agents, including the Mount Joy water system. Authority members expressed satisfaction for their previous dealings with the Col-

Mr. Collings assured Mr. Rosser that the work would be done as soon as the engineer has completed his. Mr. Rosser asked if the Authority could have a letter covering that point and Mr. Insurance Co.
