### WEATHER CONDITIONS IMPROVE BUT SOME CROPS ARE LOST

Weather conditions for Pennsylvania farm crops improved sharply in many instances during the week as rainfall—thanks in some cases to Hurricane Connie—drenched the parched ground and offered somewhat of a respite.

Many a crop however is so far gone that any amount of rainfall would be of no assistance.

In eastern Pennsylvania the corn crop ranges from fair to very poor. Many a field has simply wilted as hillside fields dried up, but corn is forming ears where conditions remotely permit.

Hay fields were at a virtual standstill in driest areas. Pastures dried up and went to pot with many a farmer in the east forced to continue feeding hay and silage to livestock. Pasture and hay seedings made little if any progress.

Potatoes too suffered from the long dry spell and tobacco has been shooting to seed in many fields due to lack of sufficient ground moisture.

All fruit needs still more rain for proper sizing although rains in some areas have been comparatively heavy. Tomato vines are withering in the southeastern section of the state where truck crops are drying up. Cooler weather and lack of high humidity would be of considerable assistance.

**NAVAL RESERVE TRAINING CENTER SPONSORING CIRCUS**

Lancaster — The Mills Brothers Circus will be in Lancaster at the Lafayette Fire Company Fair Grounds, one mile east of Lancaster on the Lincoln Highway, on Friday, September 16, it was announced by Lieut. Commander Willard C. Hatch, Commanding Officer of the Lancaster Naval Reserve Training Center, whose welfare and recreation committee is sponsoring the event.

The Mills Brother Circus, the second largest in the country, will present a three-ring, hour and a half long show, with performances in both the afternoon and the evening of the 16th of September, Lt. Cdr. Hatch said.

The welfare and recreation committee of the Naval Training Center plans to use the profit realized for the formation of a Naval Reserve Marching Band, a rifle team, and to buy athletic equipment and provide recreational facilities for the 300 men of the two Naval Divisions which train at the Lancaster Training Center.

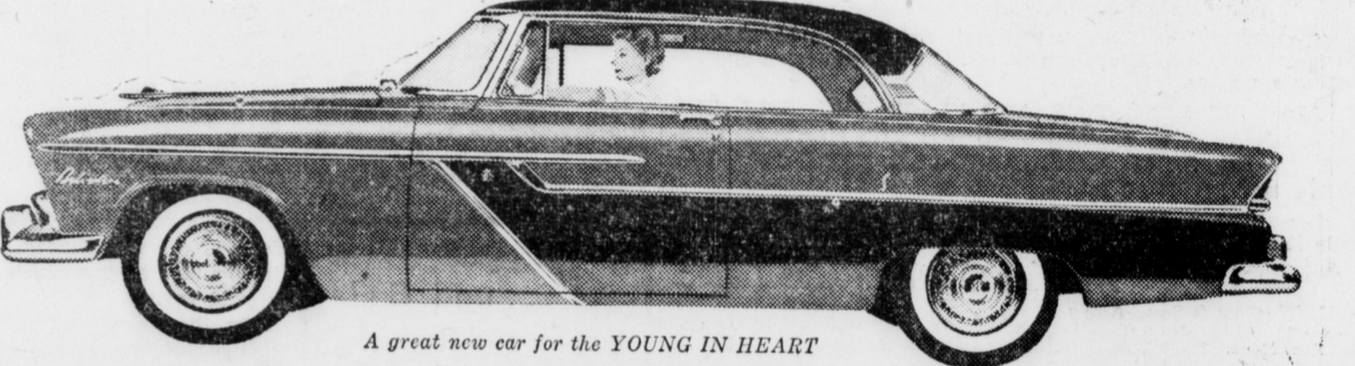
