Farm Calendar

Timely Reminders from The Pennsylvania State University College of Agriculture.

Protect Metal — One coat of metallic zinc paint, followed in three years with a second coat, will protect zinc or galvanized surfaces from rust for about 10 years. Joseph McCurdy, Penn State extension agricultural engineer, suggests a paint with 80 per cent zinc dust and 20 per cent zinc oxide in the pigment.

Manage Farm Fish — Fishing in farm ponds can provide a lot of fun for farm families, along with their neighbors and fisherman friends. For the best results, however, the fish in the farm ponds must have the management and attention they need, says Robert Wingard, a Penn State extension wildlife management specialist.

Seeds Meet Test — To provide Pennsylvania farmers the very best small grain for seed purposes, seed certification includes a rigid field inspection, reports Elmer Pifer, Penn State extension agronomist. There are also high standards of germination and purity.

Stakes for Flowers — Choose carefully materials for staking and tying plants in the flower garden, reminds A. O. Rasmussen, Penn State extension ornamental horticulturist. If wooden stakes are used, keep them shorter than the plants.

More Pigs in State — Pennsylvania's spring pig crop was 13 percent larger than the 1954 spring farrowing, reports William Carroll, Penn State extension agricultural economist.
