### DUSK HOURS DANGER TO MOTORISTS

Harrisburg -PNS - Pennsylvania State Police warned this week that the half-light hours of dusk can fool a driver into thinking he sees more clearly than he actually does. "The fading light of early evening is deceptive and brings additional danger to drivers who relax their alertness," State Police Commissioner E. J. Henry told a Pennsylvania News Service reporter.

"Approaching cars alternate blind in and stand out from their backgrounds and the last rays of the sun leave some portions of the road well lighted and the others in semi-darkness," he cautioned.

The Commissioner points out that Pennsylvania law requires that lights be used from one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise - and at any other time when there is not sufficient light to render clearly visible, persons and vehicles on the highway at a distance of 500 feet ahead.

The State Police head also emphasized that driving without the required lights is extremely dangerous. Carelessness in replacing burned out bulbs makes the vehicle a hazard to traffic - and the driver.

Failure to dim lights when approaching other cars was listed as another serious and hazardous violation. State Police on patrol are under constant orders to check motorists on these items.

### LOCAL POST OFFICE EXAMINATIONS

An examination for Substitute Clerk and Substitute Carrier for duty at the Mount Joy Post Office was announced by the Director, Third U. S. Civil Service Region.

The initial basic rate of pay for substitutes in first- and second-class post offices is \$1.71 an hour which may be increased each year thereafter until the maximum pay of \$2.13½ an hour is reached.

Applicants must either reside within the delivery of the Post Office or be bona fide patrons of each office. A written test will be given; no previous experience or education is necessary.

Applications for this examination will be accepted until September 29, 1955.
