**LANC. SYMPHONY

He has had a one-man show of his paintings at Franklin and Marshall College. Many of his pictures have adorned the Playhouse settings. He also has played several parts during the past two seasons.

Margaret Stewart and Vanita Brown will play two sisters living in New York City in "Wedding Breakfast." Jackson Young and James Ray will portray the girls' boyfriends. The comedy concerns the romantic difficulties of the two couples. Produced by Charles F. Coghlan and Gene P. Otto, the show will run through Sept. 7.
