NAVY SETS DEC. 10 FOR ANNUAL NROTC EXAM

The tenth annual competitive examination for high school seniors who desire to attend college and train for careers as Naval officers will be held throughout the nation on Dec. 10, the Navy announced today. Applications for the NROTC are now available, but must be received by November 19, the announcement added.
Successful candidates will start their Naval careers in colleges and universities across the country in 1956, with substantial financial assistance from the government. After a normal college education, graduates will be commissioned in the Regular Navy or Marine Corps, for active duty with the Fleet throughout the world.
Male citizens of the United States, between the ages of 17 and 21 are eligible to apply for the NROTC aptitude test. Persons who attain a qualifying score will be given the Navy's rigid midshipman physical examination next February. From the pool of qualified candidates, approximately 1,800 young men will be selected for appointment to the NROTC, and the college of their choice.

Postmaster General To Receive Award For Driving Record

Postmaster General Arthur E. Summerfield will accept a special safety citation Friday awarded the Post Office Dept. by the National Safety Council for the department's safe driving record in 1954.
The presentation will be made in Mr. Summerfield's office at 9:30 A. M. by A. E. Stoddard, President of the Union Pacific Railroad and a Trustee of the National Safety Council. The Postmaster General will accept the award on behalf of the 100,000 Postal people who last year drove the Department's 85,000 vehicles to a new safety record for the Postal Establishment.

Formerly the Post Office Department possessed one of the worst accident records in the entire Federal Government. Upon learning this, Mr. Summerfield shortly after he assumed office, instituted the Department's first intensive safety program which included safe driving instruction as well as driver examination and physical reaction tests.

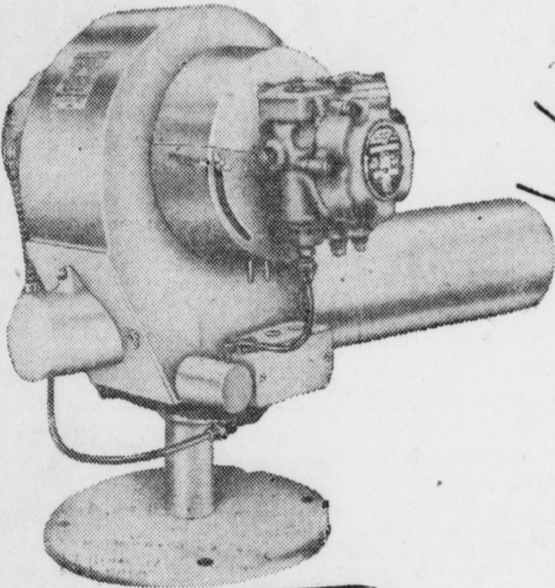
"Until that time, although there had been a Safety Officer in the Department, he had been without funds or personnel to operate effectively," Mr. Summerfield said. "We activated the Department's first truly organized and funded Safety and Health Division in the Bureau of Personnel, and staffed it with experts in industrial safety, health and safe driving."
They were given top priority to get a program going," he added. "This program is only one year old today and yet the record it has established is extraordinary."

"For example, in the last quarter of fiscal 1954, accidents involving Postal vehicles were down 11 percent and accident costs to the Department reduced 24 percent. At some installations these reductions were as much as 50 percent in the number of accidents and 75 percent in Departmental costs resulting from accidents. This year, again, the record is excellent. Costs of repairs to Postal vehicles now have been halved since the intensive safety program started."
Mr. Summerfield gave the entire credit for these results to the Safety Program and the cooperation of the 100,000 Postal drivers of 85,000 Postal vehicles have given it.
