Evangelistic Series Planned In Marietta

Invitations are being sent this week to all churches in Mount Joy for members of their congregations to attend the series of evangelistic services of the English Presbyterian church of Marietta to be held Sunday, Oct. 23 through Sunday, Oct. 30.

Rev. Leslie Van Dine, pastor of the Marietta church, the evangelism committee and the session are issuing the invitations. Rev. John D. Tate, pastor of Hamilton Presbyterian church, of Baltimore, and former pastor of First church, Mt. Joy, will be the speaker at all of the services.

Churches of all denominations in Elizabethtown, Columbia, Marietta, Maytown and Bainbridge as well as Mount Joy will receive invitations. Civic clubs and youth organizations in the tri-town area in addition to church organizations are being invited. Members may come in representative or family groups. The church organizations will receive special invitations for designated nights from chairmen in charge.

The schedule of services is: Sunday, Oct. 23, Donegal Presbytery Night; Monday, Oct. 24, Mens Night; Tuesday, Oct. 25, Community Night; Wednesday, Oct. 26, Women's Night; Thursday, Oct. 27, Mount Joy-Donegal Night; Friday, Oct. 28, Youth Rally Night; no services Saturday; and Sunday, Oct. 30, Service of Consecration.

Although each evening is accented by a special theme for special groups, all persons are invited to attend any or all evenings. All services will commence at 8 p. m. A prayer room will be open at 7:30 p. m. for those who desire a moment of meditation. There will be a nursery for pre-school children in Grove chapel.

This evangelistic mission is not local in origin but is a part of a national movement among Presbyterians to bring old as well as new members into the church and to emphasize the importance of religion in personal, community and national life. In attending, members of other denominations reaffirm their faith and rededicate themselves to the work of their chosen churches.

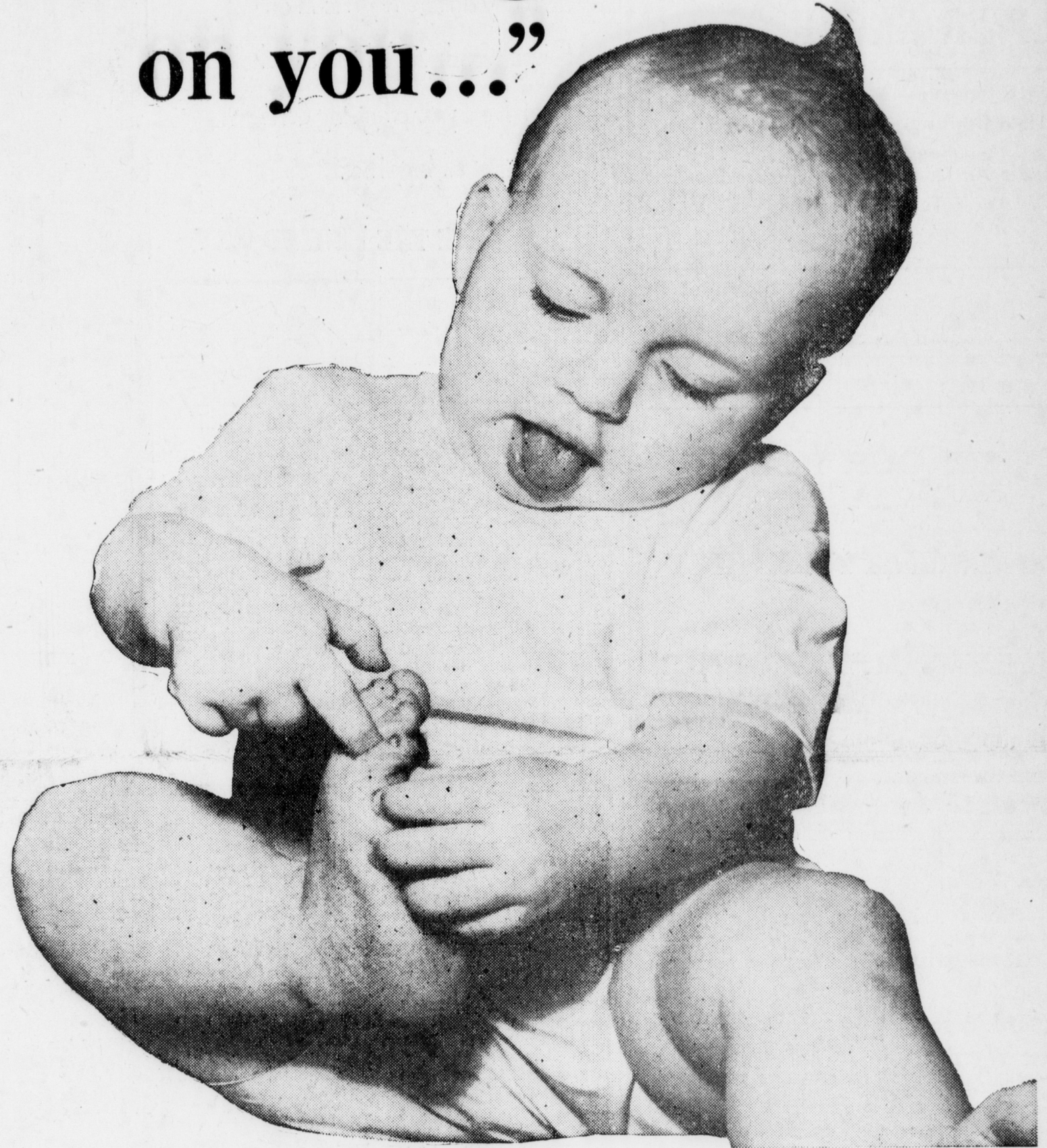
